The Douglas County Water Commission (Commission) met on August 26, 2024, and were given the opportunity to offer referral comments for the Pine Canyon Planned Development Water Appeal (Appeal) at the request of the Board of County Commissioners (Board). The following is a summary of actions and comments from each Commission member.

James Eklund: Recused himself and left the room.

<u>Frank Johns</u>: Unable to make a comment due to technology issues with online participation. Member Johns attended a majority of the meeting in person and initially expressed a desire to wait on providing input on items like this until a Water Plan is developed. Member Johns excused himself before the end of the meeting and re-joined online.

<u>Harold Smethills</u>: No comment on project. Member Smethills provided an overview of the process for the Sterling Ranch Planned Development Water Appeal and commented on the need for the water appeal process to be held to a consistent standard.

<u>Tricia Bernhardt</u>: Opposes the Appeal. Member Bernhardt is concerned with the reliance on groundwater and emphasized the need to hold to Section 18A standards.

<u>Clark Hammelman</u>: Opposes the Appeal. Member Hammelman is concerned that Castle Rock will ultimately have to serve the development should the independent water system fail and at a cost to Castle Rock Water customers.

Evan Ela: Cannot support the Appeal. Member Ela expressed there is no basis to reduce the water requirement at this time, without a completed analysis on the aquifers.

<u>Sean Tonner</u>: No comment on project. Member Tonner did not know enough about the reuse process for the project.

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<u>Jim Maras</u>: No comment on project. Member Maras did not feel educated enough about the proposal to make a comment.

<u>Don Langley</u>: Member Langley made comments in support of high-water demand standards, such as Parker Water & Sanitation District standards, to protect the aquifer for future use.

<u>Roger Hudson</u>: No comment on project. Member Hudson expressed that this conversation shows the need for a water plan in the County.

<u>Jack Hilbert</u>: No comment on project. Member Hilbert provided individual written comment prior to the project review by the Water Commission.

Pine Canyon Planned Development – Response to Town of Castle Rock Comments Concerning
 Re: Fire Protection/Emergency Medical Services

Dear Mr. Jakubowski and Mr. Pesicka:

This firm represents JRW Family Limited Partnership, LLLP (the "<u>Walker Family</u>") in connection with applications (the "<u>Applications</u>") filed with Douglas County (the "<u>County</u>") and designated as Project Files ZR2020-10 (the "<u>Rezoning</u>") and MI2020-009 (the "<u>Water Appeal</u>"). The Applications relate to certain property located within the County (the "<u>Property</u>"). Approval of the Rezoning will allow the Walker Family to develop the Property with a maximum of 800 single-family residential lots, a maximum of 1,000 multi-family units, a maximum of 600,000 square feet of non-residential square footage, an elementary school site, and approximately 176 acres of parks, open space and trails (the "**Project**"). Approval of the Water Appeal will allow for a modified water demand standard from the default standard applicable under Section 1805A of the County's Zoning Resolution (the "<u>DCZR</u>").

As part of the referral comments received by the County, the Town of Castle Rock (the "<u>Town</u>") provided "Consolidated Comments" in a letter dated July 11, 2024 (the "<u>Letter</u>"). In particular, on Page 3 of the Letter, the Town made certain inaccurate and misleading comments regarding fire protection and emergency medical services for the Project, particularly relating to the relationship between the Property and the Castle Rock Fire Protection District (the "<u>District</u>"). It is important to correct the record here. While the Walker Family has addressed these issues previously, I am writing to provide additional information and detail refuting the Town's comments regarding fire protection and emergency medical services.

To address these issues, it is first necessary to provide background on the status of the Property as it relates to the receipt of such services. The Property is included within the boundaries of the District. However, the District was dissolved in 1986 pursuant to an Order of the Douglas County District Court entered in Case No.

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80-CV-209. In connection with the dissolution of the District, the District and the Town entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement whereby the Town agreed to provide fire protection/emergency medical services within the District and the District would pay the Town for those services. The current version of the Town of Castle Rock/Castle Rock Fire Protection District Amended and Restated Intergovernmental Agreement is dated September 15, 2009 (the "<u>IGA</u>"), and a copy is attached as <u>Exhibit A</u>.

As explained in the Town's own words:

The department also receives funding from the Castle Rock Fire Protection District through a court order. In the mid-1980s, the courts established that the Town was annexing the district's tax base and was thereby reducing the ability of the district to raise funds through property tax. The court order states the Town must provide service to the district, and the district provides the Town funds based on one of three formulas as detailed in the TOWN OF CASTLE ROCK/CASTLE ROCK FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT, Article V.

Town of Castle Rock Fire and Rescue Department 2021 Fire Master Plan (the "<u>Town Fire Master Plan</u>"), pg. 5.<sup>1</sup>

Article II, Section 1 of the IGA makes clear that the Town has a legal obligation to provide fire protection services to properties within the District, which includes the Walker Family's Property:

Castle Rock shall be solely and completely responsible for the provision of fire protection and prevention services and emergency medical and rescue services throughout the entire territory of the District. It is the purpose and intent of this Agreement that Castle Rock shall fully discharge the District's obligation for service as a fire protection district . . .

The Town Fire Master Plan also acknowledges that the Town's fire department "provides all the same emergency services to the [District], as directed by court order 80-CV-209."

Article II, Section 3 of the IGA states: "The services to be provided to the District by Castle Rock will be of a comparable level as are provided within the municipal limits of Castle Rock but subject to the constraints inherent in servicing rural areas." Given its geographic proximity to the Town, the Property is not in a rural area. Indeed, it is legally classified as an "urban area" according to the County's 2040 Comprehensive Master Plan, specifically as part of an unincorporated Municipal Planning Area.

Article V of the IGA includes provisions for determining the amount of funding the District provides to the Town. Specifically, the IGA requires the District to fund a specified percentage of the Town's fire department's operations and maintenance budget, with that percentage determined based on the percentage of all Town fire department calls for service within the District, the percentage of the population of the entire area

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served by the Town's fire department that live within the District, and the approximate assessed valuation of the entire area served by the Town's fire department that is within the District. Based on the applicable funding percentage, the District is obligated to "impose rates, tolls fees or charges and certify a mill levy" in each year sufficient to pay the Town the amount owed. The IGA requires the Town and the District to meet at least every three years to determine if the current funding formula is fair and reasonable based on the factors specified (i.e., percentage of volume of service calls, percentage of population and percentage of assessed valuation). Thus, as properties within the District require more resources from the Town's fire department, the District will be required to provide additional funding to the Town. The primary funding mechanism used to generate this revenue is the District's imposition of an annual mill levy. The District's current mill levy amount is 11.300 mills, and in 2023, the District's mill levy generated a total of approximately \$1.13 million.<sup>2</sup>

Article IV, Section 2 of the IGA provides that the District remains in existence

only to such extent as is necessary to: (1) provide payment to Castle Rock for services to the unincorporated area of the District as provided under this IGA; (2) certify to Douglas County a mill levy in an amount sufficient to allow the Distinct to meets its financial commitments pursuant to Article V of this IGA; (3) ensure the performance of any condition of this IGA; and (4) negotiate any future modification of this IGA.

Accordingly, it is highly misleading for the Town to assert that the Walker Family has not "coordinated with the [District] to commit to a funding source" to serve the Project. The funding source and formula is set forth in the IGA. Because the Property is located within the District, the Walker Family pays the District's mill levy. The District's 11.300 mills constitutes the third-largest mill levy amount imposed against the Property, behind only the Re-1 School District's mill levy and the County's own mill levy. Of the approximately 85 mills in property taxes currently imposed against the Property, approximately 13.3% goes to the District. Given the present use of the Property for agricultural purposes, the assessed valuation and tax liability for the Property is currently low. However, it is anticipated that, upon full buildout of the Project, the assessed value of all of the Property will be well over \$100 million. Accordingly, over time, the District will receive millions of dollars of tax revenue from the Property, which funds can be used to pay the Town for any increases in costs for providing fire protection/emergency medical services to the Project.

It is similarly misleading for the Town to assert in the Letter that the Walker Family needs to discuss and reach agreements *with the District* concerning wildland fire mitigation and maintenance details. The District does not *exist* to perform any ongoing fire mitigation functions. All such functions are the Town's obligation under the express terms of the IGA. Moreover, these detail issues do not apply at a rezoning stage of the process, but would instead be addressed during development review and subdivision review, where the Town's fire department will be an appropriate referral agency. What is relevant for purposes of rezoning is whether such services "will be available concurrently with the impacts of such development." *See* DCZR § 1503.04. This is satisfied here because, as discussed above, the Property is in the District, and the IGA ensures that services will be provided, including providing a funding mechanism for doing so.

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Finally, the Town's assertion that it "will seek to have the Castle Rock Fire Protection District exclude this development from its jurisdiction" is completely without legal basis. Exclusion of property from the District's boundaries is governed by C.R.S. § 32-1-501, which provides only two ways in which property may be excluded. The first requires a petition requesting exclusion be submitted by the fee owner or owners of 100% of the property to be excluded. C.R.S. § 32-1-501(1). The Town does not own any of the Property, and has no right to submit such a petition. As an alternative, the board of the District, itself, could adopt a resolution to exclude property from the District or by a county fire improvement district and the board or governing body of that district has agreed by resolution to include the property into the district immediately after the effective date of the exclusion order." C.R.S. § 32-1-501(1.5)(a). The rationale for this requirement is clear: properties cannot be unilaterally excluded from the boundaries of a fire protection district and left without these critical services.

In short, the Walker Family has paid and will continue to pay property taxes to the District for fire protection services. The Town is obligated under the IGA to provide such services to all of the properties within the Project to the same extent as the Town provides such services within the Town and within the other parts of the District. Despite the Town's threats, the Property cannot and will not be removed from the District's boundaries.

The Walker Family has attempted to work with the Town concerning the development of the Property for over 20 years. That includes repeated efforts to negotiate an agreement to annex the Property to the Town. None of these efforts have been productive despite the Walker Family spending millions of dollars attempting to work with the Town in good faith. Now, the Town is going to extreme lengths to try to prevent the Walker Family from developing its Property in the County at all, including going so far in the Letter as to attempt to mislead the County on these fundamental life/safety issues.

#### TOWN OF CASTLE ROCK/CASTLE ROCK FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

THIS TOWN OF CASTLE ROCK/CASTLE ROCK FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT AMENDED AND RESTATED INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ("IGA"), made and entered into this  $15^{\tau n}$  day of  $10^{\tau}$  otherwise), 2009, by and between the Town of Castle Rock, Colorado, a home rule municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State of Colorado (hereinafter referred to as "Castle Rock"), and the Castle Rock Fire Protection District, a quasi-municipal corporation and a political subdivision of the State of Colorado (hereinafter referred to as the "District"). Castle Rock and the District are sometime referred to collectively as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, among the purposes and powers of Castle Rock is the provision of fire protection and emergency medical services; and

WHEREAS, the District was organized to provide fire protection services; and

WHEREAS, following the filing of a Petition for Dissolution and Plan for Dissolution, and approval by the electors of the District, the District was dissolved pursuant to the Findings and Order of Dissolution ("Order") entered by the Douglas County District Court on November 7, 1986, copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, as a part of the dissolution, the District entered into an Agreement with Castle Rock dated March 20, 1986 whereby Castle Rock agreed to provide fire protection services within the District and District would pay Castle Rock for said services ("Original Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Original Agreement was approved by the electors of the District at the dissolution election; and

WHEREAS, the Original Agreement has been amended three times - once in 1994 and twice in 1996. The term Original Agreement shall include all amendments thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Original Agreement required Castle Rock to provide fire protection and prevention and emergency medical and rescue services to the District comparable to the services provided within the Town in consideration of fair compensation for such services; and

WHEREAS, under the current circumstances, the Parties do not believe that the Original Agreement provides for fair compensation to Castle Rock for the services provided pursuant to the Original Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Castle Rock and District desire to amend and restate the Original Agreement to provide for a fair and equitable allocation of the cost of providing fire protection and prevention and emergency medical and rescue services between the Parties and to otherwise update the Original Agreement; and WHEREAS, the Original Agreement provides that it may be amended upon execution by Castle Rock and the District and approval of the District Court; and

WHEREAS, the Original Agreement provided that the District would impose rates, tolls, fees or charges and certify a mill levy to pay Castle Rock for the services provided pursuant to the Original Agreement and the District's operations and maintenance expenses; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized by Castle Rock and the District that the public health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of both Castle Rock and the District would be best served by providing the highest quality fire protection and emergency medical services possible in Castle Rock and the District; and

WHEREAS, political subdivisions of the State of Colorado are authorized and encouraged under the provisions of 29-1-203, C.R.S. and the Special District Act, 32-1-701, et seq., C.R.S., to cooperate or contract with one another to provide any function, service, or facility lawfully authorized to each of the cooperating or contracting units, including the sharing of costs, the imposition of taxes, or the incurring of debt, upon authorization by each party thereto with the approval of its legislative body; and

WHEREAS, Castle Rock owns and operates a fire protection system and facilities which are capable of providing adequate fire protection and emergency medical services to the territory of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing Recitals, which are incorporated herein, the mutual covenants and promises hereinafter set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Castle Rock and the District agree as follows:

#### ARTICLE I

#### EFFECTIVE DATE OF AGREEMENT AND SUPERSESSION

This Agreement shall become effective upon execution by Castle Rock and the District and approval of the Douglas County District Court which has retained jurisdiction pursuant to the Order. Upon the effective date of this Agreement, this Agreement shall supersede and replace the Original Agreement.

#### ARTICLE II SERVICES

1. Castle Rock shall be solely and completely responsible for the provision of fire protection and prevention services and emergency medical and rescue services throughout the entire territory of the District. It is the purpose and intent of this Agreement that Castle Rock shall fully discharge the District's obligation for service as a fire protection district under the authority provided by 32-1-701, et seq., C.R.S. Such responsibilities shall include, but not be limited to the following:

A. The prompt commitment of sufficient numbers of fire protection/prevention personnel to adequately and effectively furnish the complete fire protection and prevention services to the District which are contemplated by this Agreement.

B. The commitment of so much of Castle Rock's firefighting equipment as may be necessary to adequately, effectively and promptly furnish the complete fire protection and prevention services to the District which are contemplated by this Agreement. This commitment shall include any future equipment that may be acquired throughout the effective term of this Agreement.

C. The prompt commitment of Castle Rock's emergency medical and rescue services in the event of any medical emergency within the District.

D. Castle Rock's Fire Chief, or designee, shall act as the Fire Marshal of the District so that the performance of the necessary functions of the Fire Chief for Castle Rock shall have an equal priority with the performance of said functions by the Fire Chief for the District. These functions for the District shall include, but not be limited to the following:

(i) The performance of such fire protection and/or prevention activitics required by applicable uniform fire codes now in effect or as hereafter amended to be performed by Fire Chiefs, Fire Marshals and/or Fire Prevention Engineers. Such activities shall include but not be limited to fire prevention activities, inspection activities, compliance activities, plant checking activities and professional consultation activities relative to potential fire problems within the District. Throughout this Agreement, if the District should resolve to enforce a fire code other than the Uniform Fire Code now in effect or as hereafter amended, then every reference herein to said Uniform Fire Code shall be automatically deleted and replaced by the name of the newly adopted code, without need for any amendment to this Agreement.

(ii) Investigation and determination of the cause of any fire within the District as may be deemed appropriate by the Fire Chief.

(iii) Performance of all functions of Fire Chief as authorized by the Special District Act, Title 32, Article I, E.R.S., including but not limited to those functions provided in 32-1-1002(3), C.R.S. Castle Rock further agrees that all violations of the Uniform Fire Code (now in effect or hereinafter amended) detected by its Fire Chief within the District shall be immediately reported to the owner of the property affected. Castle Rock agrees, in addition to the above, that any violations of Colorado statutes which occur within the District, which are in any way related to fire protection and prevention, shall be reported to the District Attorney of the 18th Judicial District with respect that all legal remedies relative to any such violations be pursued.

2. Castle Rock shall also provide any and all supportive services, administrative or otherwise, that are required, relative to the provision of services to the District as necessary and

required under this Agreement. Any future expansion of services for the protection against fire, emergency medical and rescue services, not included above, shall also be provided to the area of the District. Castle Rock shall be compensated for such additional services on a like basis as a payment hereunder for services now provided.

3. The services to be provided to the District by Castle Rock will be of a comparable level as are provided within the municipal limits of Castle Rock but subject to the constraints inherent in servicing rural areas.

#### ARTICLE III

#### PERSONNEL, FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT

1. The timing of fire and emergency responses, the training of personnel, and the staffing of fire stations and equipment as well as all other operational matters shall be the responsibility solely of Castle Rock and shall be in accordance with adopted levels of services. It is understood that Castle Rock shall utilize the services of the Castle Rock Fire and Rescue Department ("Castle Rock Fire Department"). The underlying intent of this particular provision is that the service and response provided within Castle Rock and within the District shall be comparable, in light of the geographical location of the territories involved herein.

2. All firefighting and emergency medical equipment and facilities, including, but not limited to, all fire stations and firefighting vehicles and all other related firefighting and prevention accessories, shall be owned by Castle Rock. Castle Rock shall have sole and complete responsibility for providing the equipment and facilities it owns with all necessary repairs and replacements. Castle Rock shall further have the sole and complete responsibility for maintaining said equipment and facilities. It is the intent of the parties hereto that Castle Rock shall use its best efforts to maintain at all times equipment and facilities it deems necessary in a fully operational condition at all times.

3. Except as stated in this Agreement, the District shall have no liability whatsoever for direct costs of the Castle Rock Fire Department or related emergency medical, or rescue services, including, but not limited to, payment of any salary, wage, compensation, or award to any officer, employee, and/or volunteer of the Town of Castle Rock performing services under this IGA within the boundaries of the District. Additionally, the District shall not be liable for the compensation and/or indemnification of any officer, employee, or volunteer of the Town of Castle Rock for any injury or illness arising from services provided under this IGA. To the extent that the District is held liable for the payment of any damages, compensation, salaries, wages, awards or indemnifications as a result of any act or omission on the part of Castle Rock, or any of its officers, employees or volunteers acting within the scope of this IGA, then the Castle Rock, to the extent permitted by law, agrees to fully indemnify and hold harmless the District for any and all of such amounts.

#### ARTICLE IV DISSOLUTION OF THE DISTRICT

1. The District has, under the provisions of 32-1-701, <u>et seq</u>., C.R.S. and pursuant to the Order, been dissolved. The Original Agreement was the basis of the plan for continuation of services within the territory of the District and was approved by the Douglas County District Court. This IGA constitutes the basis of the plan for continuation of services.

2. Pursuant to the Order, the District shall remain in existence only to such extent as is necessary to: (1) provide payment to Castle Rock for services to the unincorporated area of the District as provided under this IGA; (2) certify to Douglas County a mill levy in an amount sufficient to allow the Distinct to meets its financial commitments pursuant to Article V of this IGA; (3) ensure the performance of any condition of this IGA; and (4) negotiate any future modification of this IGA.

#### ARTICLE V FUNDING SERVICES

1. The Parties acknowledge that a determination of the exact cost of services provided by Castle Rock to the District pursuant to this IGA cannot be determined with exactitude. For the purposes of this IGA, the term "services" encompasses both fire protection and prevention services and emergency medical response and rescue services, but excludes EMS transport costs. Nevertheless, Castle Rock and the District agree that the following methodology for estimating the appropriate payment of the services provided to the District is fair and reasonable.

A. As of the date of this IGA, the Parties stipulate that:

(i) 5% = approximate percentage of all Castle Rock Fire Department calls for service within the District;

(ii) 5% = approximate percentage of the population of the entire area served by the Castle Rock Fire Department that live within the District;

(iii) 10.5% = approximate assessed valuation of the entire area served by the Castle Rock Fire Department that is within the District.

B. Based upon the foregoing, the Parties agree that the District proportional cost for the services provided pursuant to this Agreement is five and five/tenths percent (5.5%) of the total annual operations budget, exclusive of capital expenditures, of the Castle Rock Fire Department.

C. The District shall impose rates, tolls, fees or charges and certify a mill levy to the Douglas County Commissioners no later than December 15 of each calendar year in an amount sufficient to pay Castle Rock five and five/tenths percent (5.5%) of the total annual

operations and maintenance budget of the Castle Rock Fire Department for the following year (e.g. 12/15/10 mill levy certification will reflect costs in 2011 Castle Rock Fire Department operations and maintenance budget). The District shall impose rates, tolls, fees or charges and mill levy sufficient to pay Castle Rock, as provided above, and to pay for the District's annual operations and maintenance expenses, including, but not limited to, legal and accounting, in an amount determined by the District.

D. The Parties shall meet by July 1 of 2011, 2014, 2017 and every third year thereafter to determine if the current percentage and funding formula is fair and reasonable based upon the then current factors, including those listed in paragraph A, above. If the Parties cannot mutually agree upon the percentage, the current percentage shall remain in force and Castle Rock or the District can petition the District Court for a determination of a fair and reasonable percentage.

2. The District shall pay to Castle Rock the amounts determined pursuant to the foregoing paragraph 1.B. and 1.C. pursuant to the terms hereof.

3. By way of example, if the methodology set forth herein were used to determine the amount payable by the District to Castle Rock in 2009, the amount due would be calculated as follows:

A. As of the date of this IGA, the 2009 Castle Rock Fire Department operations and maintenance budget (which excludes capital costs) is \$8,331,131.

B. Five and five/tenths percent (5.5%) of current Castle Rock Fire Department operations and maintenance budget is \$458,212.

C. The District's assessed valuation (as determined by Douglas County on December 5, 2008) is \$75,543,427.

D. In order for the District to raise \$458,212 based upon its current assessed valuation, the District would certify a mill levy of at least 6.07 mills.

4. One-half of all amounts due to Castle Rock pursuant to this IGA for a particular year shall be paid no later than July 1 of that year. The additional one-half of all such amounts due shall be paid by the District to Castle Rock on or before October 1 of said year, provided that if the District has not received sufficient amounts of its tax revenues from the Douglas County Treasurer by that date, to meet its obligation to Castle Rock, then the District shall only be required to pay so much of its revenues as it has actually received on October 1. Thereafter, the District shall pay any remaining amounts due and owing to Castle Rock within ten (10) days of the date such tax revenue monies are received from the Douglas County Treasurer's Office.

5. Notwithstanding any of the other provisions of this IGA, in no event shall the District be required to make total payments to Castle Rock for any one year in excess of the amounts the District is statutorily permitted to assess under §29-1-301, et seq., C.R.S., as now in effect or as the same may be hereinafter amended.

6. If in any year the District is unable to pay to Castle Rock its percentage of the total annual budget of the Castle Rock Fire Department as set forth in Section 1 above, it shall add such deficiency to the District's subsequent year budget and the budgets for all subsequent years until such payment deficiency has been paid to Castle Rock.

7. Should Castle Rock in any one year not spend all sums budgeted and appropriated for the Castle Rock Fire Department so that its budgetary figure used to compute the District's required annual payments under this Agreement is not utilized in its entirety, then the District shall be entitled to a credit on amounts due in the succeeding year for its proportionate share of the unspent amounts to the extent the District has actually paid such amounts to the Town. The foregoing shall not apply if the Castle Rock Fire Department expenditures exceed ninety-five (95%) percent of sums budgeted and appropriated.

8. It is understood and agreed by the Parties that it is both necessary and important for the District to be allowed input into the Castle Rock Fire Department budget preparation process. Accordingly, the Fire Chief for the Castle Rock Fire Department shall give written notice of the commencement of preparation of such budget to the Board of Directors of the District by July 15 of each year. The District may then request or suggest items that should be included in and/or excluded from the budget, but Castle Rock shall retain final budget authority as to such matters.

9. Upon the completion of the proposed Castle Rock Fire Department budget, the Fire Chief shall notify the Board of Directors of the District, in writing, that said proposed budget is complete. Such notice shall be given to the District by October 15 of each year. The District shall then be allowed to appoint a representative to review said proposed budget on behalf of the Board of Directors of the District and to point out and attempt to resolve any conflicts or disputed points within said proposed budget with the Fire Chief.

10. After the Fire Chief has attempted to resolve all conflicts presented to the Fire Chief by the representative of the District, the proposed budget will be presented to the Castle Rock Town Council as part of the overall Town budget. At that time the representative of the District shall be allowed to make report to the Castle Rock Town Council, which report must be heard prior to the final adoption of said budget by said Town Council.

11. All notifications by the Fire Chief as provided herein shall be provided within time limitations and at such times as will permit the District to meet any and all budget requirements and the certification of the levy of the County Commissioners of Douglas County, Colorado, as required by statute. However, the District or its representative cannot delay or otherwise act in a manner with respect to the acceptance of the budget proposals that would result in Castle Rock violating its responsibilities and statutory duty for consideration and adoption of the Town budget.

#### ARTICLE VI EXCLUSION OF TERRITORY

1. Castle Rock is surrounded by the District and from time to time property within the District is annexed to Castle Rock. All such annexed territory is eligible for exclusion from the area of the District under the provisions of 32-1-501, <u>et seq</u>., C.R.S. Territory of the District annexed to Castle Rock shall be excluded from the territory of the District for all purposes including the levy for purposes of taxation. The effective date of exclusion shall be the date annexation is final under applicable statute and ordinances of Castle Rock. Provided, however, the exclusion of such annexed territory will not be effective for taxation purposes until the first day of January of the year subsequent to annexation.

The ordinances of Castle Rock annexing territory of the District shall recite the provisions of this Agreement as being a part of the plan of dissolution of the District approved by the Court in support of and as cause for the exclusion of territory to be annexed. A certified copy of any ordinance adopted by Castle Rock annexing territory of the District shall be filed with the District Court in and for the County of Douglas, Colorado, in Action No. 80CV209 and upon such filing the Court shall thereupon order the territory to be excluded from the District. Castle Rock shall cause a certified copy of any Order of Exclusion entered by the court involving annexation of territory of the District-to the area of Castle Rock to be recorded with the Clerk and Recorder of Douglas County, Colorado.

#### ARTICLE VII INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

1. The District shall not be deemed to assume any responsibility or liability for Castle Rock, relative to the negligence or intentional acts or failures to act of any officer, employee or volunteer of, or under the direction or control of Castle Rock. In the event that the District pays or is required to pay any claim arising out of the negligence or intentional act, or failure to act, of any officer, employee, or volunteer of, or under the direction or control of Castle Rock, then the District shall, to the extent permitted by law, be indemnified by Castle Rock for the amount of such claim or judgment, plus reasonable attorneys fees, court costs, expert witness fees, and all other expenses incurred by the District relative to such matter.

2. Castle Rock will make full provision for workmen's compensation insurance, as well as social security, disability, and unemployment insurance for its employees, officers, and volunteers performing under this IGA as required by the laws of the state of Colorado and/or of the Federal Government and will, upon request, exhibit evidence thereof to the District.

3. Castle Rock shall maintain at its sole cost and expense insurance coverage applicable to the activities within the District and the District officers, employees, and/or volunteers shall be named as an additional insured. Such insurance coverage shall include:

A. Comprehensive general liability coverage and errors and omissions in amounts not less than the governmental immunity limits as provided pursuant to 24-10-101 et seq., C.R.S., protecting against any loss, liability or expense whatsoever for personal injury,

death, property damage, or otherwise, arising from or in any way connected with the management, administration, or operation of Castle Rock under this IGA. Notwithstanding such minimum coverages, the coverage provided the District as an additional insured shall be equivalent to the coverage the Town maintains for its Castle Rock Fire Department operations.

### ARTICLE VIII

#### **TERMINATION**

1. This IGA is subject to termination in the manner provided for modification as set forth in this Article VIII provided the District has made all payments due Castle Rock through the date of termination. Termination can take place only in the event a plan for continuance of services to the unincorporated area of the District is presented to and approved by the Court in Action No. 80CV209. Such plan may provide for services from other sources, the development of a plan for continuance of services by the District or by a plan imposed by the Court.

2. Written notice of intent to terminate shall be delivered by United States mail at least twenty-eight (28) months prior to January 1 of the year in which said party desires to terminate the IGA. Such notice shall specifically set forth the reason for termination and the proposed plan for continuation of services to the unincorporated area of the District in the event of termination.

### ARTICLE IX

#### MISCELLANEOUS

1. The boundaries of the District shall be those boundaries presently on file with the Douglas County District Court, relative to the Castle Rock Fire Protection District or as may be modified by the exclusion of territory pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement. It is the property within the boundaries of the District which this Agreement contemplates serving with fire protection and prevention and emergency medical and rescue services. The District may not include any additional property within the District unless with the mutual consent and agreement of Castle Rock.

2. Castle Rock may not, voluntarily or involuntarily assign, delegate, subcontract, pledge, hypothecate or encumber any right, duty or interest, in whole or in part, in or of this IGA unless such transfer of responsibilities includes the entirety of the Castle Rock Fire Department service area, without the express written consent of the District under an approved modification of the plan of dissolution on file with the Court and any attempt to do so shall be null, void, and of no effect.

3. Procedure for modification of this IGA shall be as follows:

A. Castle Rock shall, by written entry of appearance in the matter of the District's Petition for Dissolution, Case No. 80CV209 in the District Court in and for the County of Douglas, State of Colorado, and by agreement of the parties, consent to the Court's continuing jurisdiction over dissolution for the purpose of considering any matters enumerated below.

B. If Castle Rock or the District desires to amend the terms of this IGA, such party shall give written notice of the intent to amend, to the other party. Said written notice shall set forth the proposed amendment and shall designate the party or parties who will serve as the negotiating representative for the party giving said notice. Within fifteen (15) days from the date of receipt of said written notice, the party receiving notice shall designate its negotiating representative and shall inform the party giving said written notice of this choice. The negotiating representatives shall attempt, in good faith, to reach an agreement concerning the proposed amendment; and, if an agreement is reached, then said amendment shall be reduced to writing and executed on behalf of the parties and submitted to the Court for approval. Upon approval by the Court, the modification shall be made a part of this IGA.

C. All issues between the parties relating to the performance of any condition of this IGA, including negotiations relating to any future modifications, may be resolved by whatever means are mutually agreeable to both parties.

D. In the event the parties hereto are not able to agree to a procedure or the actual resolution of any particular issue, either party may proceed by application directly to the District Court in and for the County of Douglas, State of Colorado, in Civil Action No. 80CV209, for resolution of said issue or issues.

4. The records of the District and of Castle Rock which are not otherwise privileged and confidential to either entity under the provision of law relating to any matter in connection with this IGA shall be open for inspection and duplication upon written request of either party.

5. Waiver of any breach of any of the provisions of this Agreement by either Castle Rock or the District shall not constitute a continuing waiver or a waiver of any subsequent breach by either Castle Rock or the District either of said provision or of any other provision of this IGA.

6. The financial obligation of the District under the Original Agreement to pay Castle Rock for fire and emergency services and to impose a mill levy to support such obligations, which is continued and carried forward under this IGA, was authorized by the voters of the District prior to the adoption of Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution (TABOR) and therefore constitutes a valid, pre-TABOR obligation of the District.

7. This IGA contains the entire agreement between the parties hereto and no statement, promise, or inducement made by either party or the agent of either party that is not contained in this IGA shall be valid or binding.

8. The article and paragraph headings and any other titles contained herein arc intended for convenience and reference only and are not intended to define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any provisions of this IGA.

9. Invalidation of any of the provisions of this IGA or of any paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word herein, or the application thereof in any given circumstance, shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement.

10. Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns.

11. Time is of the essence for the performance of each and every provision hereof.

12. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Colorado.

13. Any notice required under the provisions of this Agreement shall be given by United States mail, postage prepaid, to the following:

FINDINGS AND ORDER OF DISSOLUTION

IN RE THE MATTER OF THE ORGANIZATION OF THE CASTLE ROCK FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, a quasi-municipal corporation,

THE CASTLE ROCK FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, a quasi-municipal corporation,

Petitioner.

THE COURT has examined the Report and Certification of Election Results filed herein by the Castle Rock Fire Protection District and has further examined all documents and pleadings on file herein relating to the dissolution of said District and based thereon,

THE COURT FINDS AS FOLLOWS:

A. On or about March 11, 1986, the Board of Directors of Castle Rock Fire Protection District, Douglas County, Colorado, {"the District") duly filed with the Court a Petition for Dissolution of the District, which Petition was accompanied by all attachments required by applicable law.

B. The District has also filed herein an Agreement (Plan of Dissolution) between the District and the Town of Castle Rock ("Castle Rock") dated March 20, 1986 relating to the continued provision of fire protection services within the area of the District and the payment therefor after Dissolution of the District, and containing a complete plan of Dissolution, as required by applicable law.

C. The Court thereupon duly ordered a hearing on said Petition to be held April 17, 1986 at the hour of 8:30 A.AM and ordered Notice of the filing of said Petition, reciting applicable financial and service-related provisions of the Agreement (Plan of Dissolution), together with the date, hour and place of the Court's hearing thereon to be given as provided by law.

D. Said Notice, in the form on file herein, was duly given by publication in the <u>News-Press</u>, a newspaper of general circulation in the District, and by mailing a copy thereof to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Colorado, and to the governing body of each municipality having territory within a radius of three miles of the boundaries of the District. E. Prior to the Court hearing on said Petition, Castle Rock, as a party to the Agreement (Plan of Dissolution), submitted to the jurisdiction of this Court in these proceedings by written Entry of Appearance.

F. Following the Court's hearing hearing April 17, 1986, at which the Court carefully considered the Agreement (Plan of Dissolution), the Court on May 13, 1986 made the findings set forth in its written Order of said date and duly submitted the question of Dissolution of the District to the electors thereof, such election to be held September 2, 1986.

G. Notice of said election, in the form attached as Exhibit A to the Report and Certification of Election Results filed by the District, was duly published in the News-Press, a newspaper of general circulation in the District, on August 5, August 12, and August 19, 1986.

H. The election was duly and regularly held on September 2, 1986, and a majority of the electors voting thereat approved the question of Dissolution.

I. The District has no outstanding bonds. The Agreement (Plan of Dissolution) adequately provides for the discharge of existing financial obligations of the District, the continued provision of fire protection and related services within the area of the District, and the funding needed to finance such services following dissolution.

A prior agreement between the the District and Castle J. Rock, dated June 1, 1982, currently in effect, provides for the furnishing of fire protection and related services by Castle Rock within the area of the District, and such agreement is the only means by which such services have been or can be furnished within such area pending implementation of the service and payment provisions of the Agreement (Plan of Dissolution) dated March 20, The District has paid Castle Rock the sum of \$40,025.36 1986. under the prior agreement for fire protection services through the end of 1986. Article I, Section 3 of the Agreement (Plan of Dissolution) provides for the termination of the prior agreement upon the effective date of any Order of Dissolution entered in these proceedings. Fire protection and related services furnished under the prior agreement are essential to the public health, safety and welfare and must be continued until such services are provided under the new Agreement (Plan of Dissolution) at the beginning of 1987. No prejudice will result to any party or to the public from the Court's modifying the said Article I, Section 3 of the Agreement (Plan of Dissolution) to provide for the extension of services under the prior Agreement through the end of 1986.

K. All requirements of Part 7, Article 1, Title 32, C.R.S. as amended, have been met in connection with these proceedings.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Castle Rock Fire Protection District, Douglas County, Colorado, is hereby dissolved under and subject to the terms of the Agreement (Plan of Dissolution) between the District and the Town of Castle Rock dated March 20, 1986.

2. Subject to Section 4 of this Order, the provisions of said Agreement (Plan of Dissolution), including without limitation those applicable to the continued provision of fire protection and related services within the area of the District and the funding needed to finance such services, are incorporated herein by reference as though set forth verbatim.

3. Kent Brandebery, Virginia Hickey, George Peticlerc, Josie Pike, and Richard W. Blackwood shall remain in office as Directors of the District to perform those duties and functions specified in the Agreement (Plan of Dissolution) and in subsections (3) and (4) of Section 32-1-707, C.R.S. as amended. The Directors shall further be authorized and empowered to conduct on behalf of the District such proceedings as may be necessary to exclude from the area of the District those lands within the boundaries of the District which are also located within the boundaries of Castle Rock as of the effective date of this Order. They shall have and retain all rights, powers, privileges, and authority as may reasonably be necessary, proper, convenient or useful in the performance of such duties and functions. Such persons shall not be subject to election to the offices of Director of the District. Any vacancies on the Board of Directors shall be filled by appointment of the Court.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of Article I, Section 3 of the Agreement (Plan of Dissolution), Castle Rock shall continue to furnish fire protection and related services within the area of the District required of it under the terms of the prior Agreement between the parties through and until 12:01 A.M. on January 1, 1987. At that time, the said prior Agreement shall be deemed terminated and of no further force or effect, and the provisions of the Agreement (Plan of Dissolution) relating to the continued provision of fire protection and related services within the area of the District shall become effective. 5. The Court shall have and retain continuing jurisdiction over these proceedings for the purposes of considering any further modifications of the Agreement (Plan of Dissolution) or other questions concerned with the performance of the said Agreement, and for such other purposes as may from time to time be provided by the laws of Coloradge

Commissioners -

The purpose of my correspondence today is to express my opposition the Pine Canyon development moving forward in unincorporated Douglas County. From an urban planning perspective a development completely surrounded by incorporated Castle Rock would be an abomination.

The fact that this development will require a stand alone wastewater treatment plant should be reason enough to reject the development in unincorporated Douglas County. The cost to construct, operate, and maintain the plant will far exceed the cost of connecting to the existing Castle Rock system.

If the proponents of the metropolitan district and development are saying anything to the contrary, I would suggest that they are flat out lying. If you look around the state and/or the country you will find that small utility systems are having a difficult time updating treatment facilities without significant federal subsidies. You need to look beyond the initial build, and see the operational costs, maintenance costs, and ultimately the replacement cost of the plant.

If you consider yourselves conservative in any nature, you should know that you are setting up this development to be ultimately more expensive than annexing to the town and connecting to the towns wastewater system. The residents of Pine Canyon will ultimately be looking for government handouts to "save" them. Not very conservative.

Finally, a development of this nature surrounded by incorporated Castle Rock will be a suck on Castle Rock services and will not provide the same level of resources to the community. They will receive the benefit of living adjacent to town services, but won't be paying for them. They will require policing services that will likely have Castle Rock Police Department as first responders.

My comments are by no means meant to say that I am not in favor of the development, I am suggesting that you should reject the development due to its requirement for duplicative services. One of the requirements in approving a metropolitan district is to prove that there isn't the availability of services in the area, which is blatantly false if the proponent is suggesting such. Castle Rock certainly has utility capacity to serve the proposed development.

Do the right thing from a service and planning perspective and reject this development in unincorporated Douglas County.


Without some form of traffic abatement to address the Walker development growth as well as the Crowfoot valley traffic we're being very short sighted.

It reads more like an attempt to check the box saying you gave the community a chance to be heard with no real intention of doing so. It is not playing well in my corner of the Castle Rock community.

With that, I and many others in this community are doggedly OPPOSED to this development as currently proposed. Such a move without acting to satisfy the Town of Castle Rock's documented concerns/solutions would demonstrate what I consider to be reckless behavior and a complete lack of intellectual honesty and integrity on the part of County Commissioners and the developer (<u>https://www.crgov.com/DocumentCenter/View/46486/Pine-Canyon-Planned-Development-Proposal-Douglas-County-Referral-CL?bidId=f</u>). Of the many valid and supportable concerns The Town expressed to the County, the most egregious to many in my neighborhood (Blacktail at the Meadows) is the proposed sewage treatment facility near Prairie Hawk Drive.

Just over a year ago, my family and I purchased a home directly across the road from the proposed sewage treatment facility location. The construction of such a facility at that location would very likely create a severely negative impact on our quality of life and would be damning for our property values. It seems clear that existing facilities can accommodate proposed demands, so moving forward with this plan would be done so with absolutely no regard for the human or environmental impact on the surrounding areas.

I moved to Castle Rock for its beauty, conveniences, and community. It is a wonderful place to live and this development apparently seeks to capitalize on that WITHOUT working with The Town. Consequently, this plan also serves to damage what makes Castle Rock so appealing in the first place. Please do not allow blind ambition and greed to compromise what makes Castle Rock so great. Real people live here. This development would have real negative impacts on the health and welfare of many residents. #### 1. Introduction

Air quality and its pollution (physical, chemical, and biological) significantly influences the health and good living of humans, animals, or plants inhabiting it [1, 2]. Despite the fact that the air is an unfavourable environment for microorganisms to grow, it is merely a place which temporarily occupy and move in. The air is very often called "transport environment" because microorganisms may be present and often can be transported over considerable distances [1]. Microorganisms move in the air as a consequence of wind movement, which "sweeps" them away from various habitats and surroundings (soil, water, waste, plant surfaces, animals, and other), or are introduced during the processes of sneezing, coughing, or sewage aeration [2].

Wastewater treatment plant (WTP), due to its working conditions, is considered as a major source of aerosols and may constitute an important health risk for plant workers as well as the surrounding inhabitants [2–5]. Various bacterial and fungal communities have been isolated from all types of aerobic and anaerobic WTPs [6]. Several studies have shown that bacteria contained in droplets of WTPs were 10– 1000 times more than that in a water source, depending on the droplet size [3]. A number of atmospheric factors such as temperature, wind velocity, smog, and specific humidity influence the aerosol spread as well as the ability of microorganisms to survive in the air. At very low humidity and high temperature, microbes face dehydration, whereas high humidity may give cells protection against the solar radiation [3, 4, 7]. It has also been reported that UV radiation, oxygen content, specific ions, various pollutants, and air-associated factors are also responsible for the decrease of the biological activity in a WTP [7, 8].

Bioaerosols may contain different types of microorganisms such as viruses, pathogenic bacteria, and fungi, capable of causing skin, digestive system, respiratory, and nervous system diseases and human allergies [9]. Specifically, bioaerosols emitted by WTPs can impact the air quality. In the past, microbial concentrations in the surrounding air from the aeration tanks of WTPs, at different heights and different distances, have been reported [10–12].

Waste management facilities generate atmospheric emissions and liquid effluent, which may be hazardous to human health. The potential health hazards related to WTP aerosols are documented commonly for occupational exposure. Effects including respiratory and digestive symptoms have been reported in workers exposed to particulate matter and bioaerosols [9]. Similar health problems may occur in people living near such plants who may be exposed to this release. To guide the implementation of waste management policies, decision-makers need information about their potential effects on public health.

In the city of Patras, south western Greece, a municipal wastewater treatment plant receiving domestic sewage from approximately 250,000 citizens is located in a densely inhabited area. The WTP effluents flow to the Patraikos gulf through a submarine pipe delivering the treated effluents in approximately 100 m from the coastline. Within a radius of 100–500 m around the WTP, 800 to 1000 inhabitants are permanently living. In order to assess the impact on the quality of life of citizens living close to the WTP, an observational case control study, as well as a microbiological analysis of air close to the living areas, was performed. It is the first time that such an observational survey has been performed in Greece. It is one of the very few studies combining microbiological and epidemiological data in an area close to a wastewater treatment plant.

### 2. Materials and Methods

The Patras' wastewater treatment plant (WTP) has a mean inflow of  $45,000 \text{ m}^3/\text{d}$  receiving municipal waste from 250,000 inhabitants. It is a secondary WTP which includes indoor pretreatment with screens and coarse bubble aerated grit clambers, outdoor primary and secondary settling tanks, outdoor chlorination, and indoor sludge processors with belt filter presses.




FIGURE 1: Microbiological sampling stations and results as well as questionnaire locations in a perimeter of a radius of 500 m.

2.1. Study Population. The study population was comprised of inhabitants living in the surrounding area of the WTP (up to 500 m radius) considered as cases. A case included any resident, living permanently for more than eight hours per day in an area (<500 m) from the WTP. As a control was considered a resident living permanently in an area located more than 5 km from the WTP. The participants, cases and controls, were matched according their demographic, socioeconomic, ethnic, and occupational background. Inclusion criteria in the study were the permanent residency in the region, the age above 18 years, and the agreement to complete the questionnaire. Cases travelled and stayed abroad as well as individuals who were working far from their house for more than 10 hours every day or who resided in the regions for less than a year were excluded from the study (Figure 1).

*2.2. Study Design.* Study participants completed a structured self-administered validated questionnaire distributed at their homes [13]. Participation was on a voluntary basis. The questionnaire was divided into three parts and contained 60 questions.

The first part (23 questions) assessed baseline characteristics including sociodemographic variables such as age, sex, family status, education, occupation, place of work, socioeconomic status, life habits (tobacco and/or alcohol), and general health perception. The health status was indicated by a distinction between poor and good health. The exact wording and response option of current health question is consistent with recommendations of the WHO [14] and the EURO-REVES 2 group [15]. Participants were asked, "In general how would you describe your current health status." Those who responded "very good" "good" or "satisfying" were considered to be in good health, while those who responded "poor" or "bad" health were considered to be in poor health.

The second part (10 questions) was concerned with the medical history of participants: presence and frequency of gastrointestinal and respiratory symptoms, joint pains, and central nervous system symptoms (including headache, unusual tiredness, and concentration difficulties). Special questions were related to physician diagnosed allergy, eczema, and asthma. The grouping of symptoms was as follows: respiratory (asthma, chronic bronchitis, and chronic sinusitis), gastrointestinal (abdominal pain and bloating, nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea, constipation, and jaundice), skin (skin rash, ulcer on the skin) or systemic (headache, fever, chest pain or discomfort, muscle spasms, chills, irritability, insomnia, fatigue, weakness, and vague general discomfort or feeling of illness), allergies at last year (drugs, powder, materials, etc.), blood diseases (thalassemia, leukaemia), and musculoskeletal diseases (osteoporosis, backache).

The third part (27 questions) related to health-related quality of life and overall life satisfaction. The questions assessed the occurrence of four subjective physical and psychological health complaints, namely, being moody, irritable, bad tempered, and unhealthy.

The questionnaire has been piloted into 20 respondents before its use. Also, a test-retest system was used to assess the reproducibility of the responses, 20 subjects being required to complete a second questionnaire after one-month interval.

2.3. Air Sampling Strategy. Sampling of aerosols was performed once a week for four consecutive weeks during summer period, from 6 sampling stations in an area of 500 m radius around of the Patras' WTP. The sampling points were recorded using a GPS instrument (Magellan Explorist, Aachen, Germany). Three samplings were performed at different times of each sampling day (morning 8.30 a.m., afternoon 18:00 p.m., and night 22:00 p.m.) from each sampling station, in order to monitor the presence of microorganisms during the whole day. Microbiological investigation was carried out during ordinary workdays when biological treatment plant was normally working. Throughout the studied period, during air sampling, air temperature, relative humidity, wind direction and speed, and solar radiation were measured.

During each sampling period, an average of three readings of humidity and temperature was recorded. The temperature (expressed in °C) and the relative humidity (expressed in %) were measured with a portable instrument (Opus 10 Lufft, Germany).

Aerosol samples were collected using a sampler (International PBI Surface Air System, SAS, Italy). Petri dishes (55 mm diameter) containing 25 mL of Tryptic Soy Agar medium, (TSA Merck, Darmstadt, Germany) were placed into a special support of the sampler. The sampling flow rate was 90 L/min. A 15 min sampling time (volume of air > 1000 L) was used and samples were transported to the laboratory within 2 hours for further analysis. The air sampler was disinfected with 70% denaturized ethanol (CarloErba, Milano, Italy) after each sampling. Petri dishes were incubated at 36°C (±1°C) for 24 hours. After the incubation period, one experienced analyst enumerated bacterial colonies on each plate based on their cell morphology. Bacterial colonies were differentiated on the basis of colony morphology, Gram staining, and catalase and oxidase test. Following Gram staining, at least three characteristic and distinctive Gram negative colonies from each plate were identified using the API system (bioMerieux, Marcy l'Etoile, France). Also Staphylococcus spp. (ISO 6888-2:1999), Enterococcus spp. (ISO 7899-02:2000), and total coliforms/Escherichia coli (ISO 9308-1:2000) were identified. The concentration of airborne bacteria was finally expressed as colony forming units (CFU)/m<sup>3</sup>. No major environmental problems were reported at the sampling stations during the survey period. Concentrations on a limited number of days were considered representative of the annual microbial concentrations.

2.4. Statistical Analysis. All statistical analysis was conducted with SPSS 21.0, while, for the mapping, Arc-GIS 9.2 software was applied (ESRI, USA). Data were analysed using descriptive statistics (Chi-test) and logistic regression to determine odds ratios and statistical significance. Differences in selected demographic variables, as well as smoking and health status, between the cases and the controls were evaluated by the Chisquare test. Student's *t*-test was used to evaluate continuous variables, including age and pack-years of cigarette smoking. Unconditional multivariate logistic regression analysis was employed to examine the association of living near the WTP and the development of health problems by estimating odds ratio (ORs) and 95% confidence intervals (95% CI).

The baseline characteristics were compared between the two study groups using the Chi-square and *t*-tests. Multivariate analyses, using a logistic regression model, were conducted to compare the prevalence of the investigated chronic diseases, adjusted for demographics and health-related habits. Comparisons of the questionnaire components were performed with Mann-Whitney U test, and for multivariate analysis linear regression models were computed. The independent variables for the models were demographics, health-related habits, and chronic conditions.

Nonparametric statistics were usually used to test for relationships between pathogen concentration and other factors, because total airborne bacteria (TAB) were not normally or log-normally distributed. A nonparametric Mann-Whitney test was used to determine whether there were significant differences in microorganism concentrations based on the factors evaluated in this study. Spearman's correlation analyses were used to examine the relationship between microorganism concentration and the other factors. A nonparametric Kruskal-Wallis test and analysis of variance were also performed to determine whether there were differences in microorganism concentration by sampling location and date. A P value lower than 0.05 was considered significant, for all statistical analyses. All values are expressed as mean (SD).

## 3. Results

#### 3.1. Questionnaire Validation

*3.1.1. Acceptability.* Ten subjects (4.2%) refused to complete the questionnaire.

*3.1.2. Feasibility.* Three subjects (1.3%) failed to complete the questionnaire owing to poor eyesight.

The average time for completion was 15 minutes (range 10 to 20 minutes). The completion rate for the questionnaire was 90% of all questions.

*3.1.3. Reproducibility.* In both groups (case control) the test-retest study showed that only one answer (1.75%) was altered in one questionnaire (0.4%).

3.2. Epidemiological Survey Study. A structured questionnaire was administered to the 235 cases and 97 controls (Table 1) to obtain information on demographics, knowledge of their general health status, and determination of frequency of physical symptoms that they have experienced in the study period. All respondents were asked to give complete answers. The participants (cases and controls) self-filled in the study questionnaire and returned it anonymously indicating only the address (Figure 1).

The 86.8% of the cases were staying at home for more than 8 hours. The smoking habits of cases and controls were reported in Table 2. The 26.8% of the cases considered their healthy status as nonsatisfactory (average and bad) compared to 17.8% of the controls (P < 0.001). A statistically significant negative relationship (r = -0.58, P < 0.001) between cases living near the WTP and their general perception about their health status was also noted.

The incidence of allergies among the cases reached the 27.8% and most of them were allergic to dust and pollen. Questionnaires showed that 8.7% had iron deficiency anaemia and 27.5% were suffering from migraine headache. 7.2% had asthma and 12.9% gastritis. Dermatitis occurred in 9.3% and the medicine use reached 41.1%. The mood as well as the perception about their health between cases and control is shown in Table 3.

There was no increased rate of gastrointestinal disorders or myoskeletal diseases. Similarly, there were no significant increases in the rates for respiratory, allergic, and blood diseases. However, there was a significant increase in the rate of neural disorders (Table 4). The frequency of the symptoms is reported in Table 5. Almost all cases (79.6%) complained about strong odors coming from the WTP during the evening (40.4%), during the afternoon (20.8%), during the midday (10.7%), and during the morning (28.1%). Odors were more intense in spring (28%) and summer (36.4%) (Table 6). Cases emphasized problems due to the presence of the WTP as follows: odors (50.9%), air suspensions (1.1%), and different health problems (6.3%). It should be mentioned that 72.8% of the residents found the presence of the WTP indispensable, but 17.4% believed that it was dangerous for their health.




FIGURE 2: Measurements of humidity (a) and air temperature (b) during the study period.

3.3. Air Microbiological Study. Forty-seven (47) measurements of temperature (°C) and humidity (%) were carried out during the sampling period (Figure 2). The mean temperature was 13.6°C varying from 7 to 20°C and the mean relative humidity was 57.3%, varying from 38% to 74%. During the evening sampling campaigns, the ambient temperature ranged from 10.8 to 14.9°C and the relative humidity was approximately 67%.

Eighty-three (83) randomly selected isolated bacterial colonies were isolated and identified. Depending on their Gram staining, the microorganisms were initially mainly characterized as cocci (79.5%), as Gram positive bacilli (7.2%), and as Gram negative bacilli (13.3%). Summarized microbiological data are shown in Table 7. Twenty-four strains (29%) were identified as *Staphylococcus aureus*, 30 (36%) as *Streptococcus* spp., 4 (4.9%) as *Enterococcus* spp., and 7 (8.5%)

as *Escherichia coli*. Eighteen (21.7%) strains of bacteria could not be typed. The detected loads of airborne microorganisms at the six different sampling stations were, in general, low, but a few higher concentrations were found at the two closest sampling stations, (Locations number 1, number 3). Concentrations of airborne bacteria at each sampling station are shown in Figure 3. Among the sampling locations, Location 1 had the highest concentration of culturable airborne bacteria, with 340.89 CFU/m<sup>3</sup>. As the distance increased from the center of the WTP, the concentration of culturable bacteria gradually decreased. Mean concentrations were found lower, while the distance from the center of the WTP was increased more than 800 m. None of the collected air samples was found positive for *Salmonella* spp.




FIGURE 4: Average microbial count per sampling station (location) and sampling period (CFU/m<sup>3</sup>).




FIGURE 5: Average microbial count per sampling station (location) and sampling period (CFU/m<sup>3</sup>).

Triplicate samples of bacteria (*Streptococcus* spp., *Enterococcus* spp.) were collected at each sampling time. The airborne microbial concentrations (CFU/m<sup>3</sup>) corresponding to the three campaigns in all locations are summarized in Figure 4. The average microbial load per sampling location per day (CFU/m<sup>3</sup>) is shown in Figure 5, respectively.

#### 4. Discussion

In the present study, the impact on the quality of life of inhabitants living close to a WTP as well as the evaluation of the air microbiological quality was reported.

Air microbiological analyses have commonly been conducted close to sewage treatment plants [3]. Sawyer et al. [12] measured concentrations of 126–4840 bacterial CFU/m<sup>3</sup> at different heights above the water surface of the aeration tank of wastewater treatment plants. Brenner et al. [10] recorded concentrations of 86-7143 bacterial CFU/m<sup>3</sup> air at a distance of 25 m from the surface of an aeration basin well. Another study showed that the air densities of total aerobic bacteria-containing particles, total coliforms, faecal coliforms, faecal streptococci, total count bacteria, and coliphages increased significantly within the perimeter of the plant during operation of the wastewater treatment plants [11]. Other studies have shown that a percentage of the emitted bacterial contamination can be transported over considerable distances [10]. In our study the highest microbial numbers have been reported in the locations close to the WTP.

In order to evaluate the results of the air microbiological analyses, it should be considered that the recorded microbial loads represent only a "picture" of the sampling time. In connection, with the physicochemical properties of the air, the degree of contamination at a given point can significantly change within a few minutes [16]. An important issue of the study was the season in which the study was performed, which is known to play a significant role in the dispersion of aerosols and odors in the air, as well as microbes, especially during specific seasons of the year. Complaints related to the odors were increased during the summer months and especially during early the morning or evening, when the percentage of humidity was higher at the sampling stations. It is suggested that the seasonal variations of bacterial loads might be related to the contingent meteorological conditions





(humidity, temperature) and to the intrinsic sensitiveness of different bacteria genera to these factors [17].

Some WTPs produce higher concentrations of bioaerosols compared to others. In previous studies, using personal samplers, it was shown that sewage treatment plant employees that have a higher incidence of headache, tiredness, and nausea were exposed to culturable bacteria. Exposure to rod-shaped bacteria and total number of bacteria was significantly higher in workers reporting headache during work than in workers not reporting headache [11].

A few studies have shown that blood tests of workers who were subjected to aerosol inhalation indicated an increased level of antibodies against Gram negative bacteria and intestinal viruses. The condition has been described as "the sewage worker's syndrome," which has a viral origin and manifests itself with a despondency, overall weakness, catarrh, and fever

[11, 18]. Main characteristics of the disease included general malaise, weakness, acute rhinitis, and fever [19], accompanied by gastrointestinal symptoms. In accordance with these studies, we recorded increased odds for the inhabitants who lived near the WTP to develop neurological and myoskeletal

symptoms at 3.37 and 1.98 times, respectively. Moreover, sewage workers and those who live in the vicinity of a WTP have higher morbidity with intestinal and respiratory system illnesses [11, 20]. In order to ensure public health, health of workers, and good quality of life, it is necessary to determine the composition and concentration of microorganisms in the air. Skin contact, ingestion, and inhalation are the three major routes of exposure to airborne particles [20]. Microorganisms that are associated with intestinal infections such as *Salmonella* spp. and enteric viruses are thought to be transmitted through inhalation [4, 21].

Also, a nationwide survey in Sweden showed that an increased risk for headache, concentration difficulties, unusual tiredness, and head heaviness was reported in workers compared to the controls [18]. Similarly, in our study, feelings like tiredness and sickness were more reported by the cases compared to the controls. Interestingly, our study showed an increased rate in mental disorders to the population living near the WTP. There was no significant correlation of the WTP and the occurrence of gastrointestinal or myoskeletal symptoms to the residents. Also, this study showed no significant correlation concerning gastrointestinal, allergic, and respiratory symptoms although the study sample of the controls was rather small due to the refusal of controls (people in the city) to participate in the study.

In our study, there is a significant presence of possible pathogenic microorganisms in the aerosols close to WTP and this concentration depended on the distance. There is indication of the burden of microorganisms in air according to the distance of the inhabitants. To establish aerosols impact on the human health, more extensive studies are needed including medical examinations in inhabitants. Such studies have not been performed to the area of the WTP.

In order to lower the impact for public health, in areas like this, retaliatory preventive measures should be taken by the authorities in order to protect inhabitant's health. Such measures could be considered the tree growing around the WTP as well as the appropriate function of the WTP with protective equipment for the aerosols.

Good afternoon commissioners,

I am writing to you today as a resident of Castle Rock, asking you to vote No on the Pine Canyon proposed development and rezoning.

While losing the stunning open views of the property is itself enough reason to reach out to you, my deep concerns pertain to the substantial negative impact and burden this development would have on the town and residents of Castle Rock.

Currently, this parcel is zoned A1 (Agricultural), so I ask you to consider: *would this proposed zoning change provide a substantial benefit to the surrounding community?* As a homeowner in this area of town, I can answer "No." Not only would this not provide any substantial benefits to the surrounding community, it would in fact unfairly burden local residents and the town of Castle Rock.

The development is surrounded by the town of Castle Rock on three sides (the fourth being the relative's agricultural land). As such, all traffic will immediately exit the development onto Castle Rock's roads--without paying one cent for the maintenance and construction of those roads, despite the tens of thousands of vehicle trips per day that would be generated by this development. This creates a grossly unfair burden to the town and its current residents.

However, the traffic and sightline impacts are all secondary to the endangerment of the town of Castle Rock's water supply.

In a time of increasing wildfire risk, and with communities (Douglas county included) looking to the future in securing long-term renewable water rights, this is not when one should be considering <u>lowering</u> the standards for new developments. Plain and simple, if they don't have the water, no exception should be made. Our standards should only be increasing as we face the stark reality of depleting our underground water supplies. As it stands, the applicant is asking you to approve a roughly 2/3 reduction in the county-required

nonrenewable groundwater per single family residence--and this is actually a nearly 4/5 reduction when looking at the town of Castle Rock's water requirements! Honestly, I'm shocked that the commissioners would even consider this proposal on this one point alone. Add to that the fact that Castle Rock Fire cannot service the development due to inadequate water supplies in the proposal, and you are now considering endangering not only the potential homeowners in this development, but also the existing homeowners on all sides whose homes would be gravely endangered should a fire break out, as we have sadly witnessed happening across the Front Range over these last few years.

One of the unique points of this proposal is that it eschews established wastewater providers in favor of building their own wastewater treatment facility--adjacent to the most active trail in town, near Castle Rock's established wastewater treatment facilities. Not only is this the exact opposite of land use and water planning best practices, this endangers Castle Rock's own water supply and stormwater system with the treated wastewater they plan to spray on lawns and open space in the development. I find it quite hard to believe that the Board would go to great lengths to create a water commission, only to consider developments that go against water best practices, rely solely on nonrenewable groundwater, and provide so much less than their fair share of water for residents.

These are only a few of the deep concerns I have with this project. I think you would agree that the proposed development does not offer substantial benefit to the surrounding community, but rather ensures direct harm to the town of Castle Rock and surrounding residents. I am asking you, for my family and my town, to vote no on rezoning this property, and instead keep the current zoning of A1 Agricultural.

Dear Commissioners Thomas, Teal and Laydon:

We add our support to the growing number of those expressing opposition to the proposed Pine Canyon development.

Among the other valid concerns expressed by the Town of Castle Rock, both the wastewater treatment and the water supply proposals made by the developer are highly significant.

It is important to consider that the proposed project, while in unincorporated Douglas County, is not simply an undeveloped tract surrounded by other unincorporated and undeveloped property. Nor is it simply boarded on a side by another developed area. Rather, the proposed development, while on unincorporated property, is completely bordered and surrounded by the Town of Castle Rock, which has a population in excess of 80,000 residents.

Inasmuch as the proposed development is entirely surrounded by the Town of Castle Rock, we believe it imperative that the Board of County Commissioners recognize and defer to the Town's requirements for development, especially as it concerns the wastewater treatment process and the development and use of water supply.

We have resided here for over 40 years. During that time, Castle Rock has taken significant strides both in its processing of wastewater and its development of a water supply that is designed to rely less on nonrenewable groundwater supply system. These standards may be stricter, in some respects, than those that have been permitted in other unincorporated areas of Douglas County. But those other areas are not completely bordered by an existing Town as is this proposed project.

While recognizing that development and population expansion is inevitable, especially in Douglas County, we believe it is also essential under the unique circumstances that exist here, to give Castle Rock the ability to require that the proposed development – located entirely within the Town of Castle Rock - meet its standards for water and wastewater treatment.

Dear Commissioners:

My wife and I live in the Cobblestone Ranch area of Castle Rock, and we wish to voice our deep concerns about the Pine Canyon Planned Development (Project Files: ZR2020-010 and MI2020-009)(referred to herein as "PC").

As you know, PC contemplates, *inter alia*: (a) the construction of 1,800 new residences, (b) the installation of a "mobility hub," (c) and creation of the Pine Canyon Water and Sanitation District.

#### 1. Flawed and deficient traffic study

The Traffic Study ("Study") prepared by Kimley Horn and submitted to the County is flawed and deficient in several areas.

**First – outdated**: The Study was prepared in 2021 and relies substantially on data from 2018. The Study, therefore, is significantly outdated and should be revised using current data, not data that is six years old. Goodness, the nearby 1,200 home Cobblestone Ranch development has been largely completed since the Study was prepared. PC should do a new and comprehensive analysis of existing and potential traffic flows using current data, and then resubmit the updated Study to the Planning Commission for further consideration before any approval is issued by the Planning Commission and then submitted to you for final approval.

<u>Second – deficient Staff Report</u>: The Planning Commission Staff Report ("Staff Report") fails to provide any critical analysis of the Study. Rather, the Staff Report simply recites the road improvements that PC has proposed. You as the Commissioners rightfully rely upon your staff

reports. You should insist that your staff use critical analysis so that you can make informed and correct decisions.

<u>Third – ignores additional traffic nearby</u>: The Study fails completely to contemplate, much less incorporate, the additional traffic that will be generated by the Canyons Far South project that lies almost directly across from PC on the east side of Founders Parkway. That project is planned for 521 new homes. Thus, this area of Castle Rock would have 2,321 new homes. The Study, however, fails to address these additional 521 homes in the same area. That is a fatal failure in our opinion.

**Fourth – Wildfire**: The Study fails to address the traffic effects when (not if) a wildfire comes through this area. Can you imagine what would happen if 2,321 families simultaneously have to evacuate this area when a wildfire occurs? And what would be the additional impact if the evacuation occurs during the rush hours? We fear that many people, including children and the elderly, could easily die painful deaths because they were caught in their cars. Do you want that on your conscience?

<u>Fifth – mobility hub</u>: The Study fails completely to address what additional traffic impacts will occur due to the planned "mobility hub."

<u>Sixth – Town cooperation</u>: The Study repeatedly states that PC will require the cooperation of the Town of Castle Rock in many different areas. As you know, however, the Town of Castle Rock is deeply opposed to PC and has formally notified you of its opposition. Can you realistically expect PC to receive Town cooperation given its opposition? Also, in this regard, the Staff Report notes on pages 20 - 21 that "The Town of Castle Rock has not accepted the TIA and the traffic commitments proposed by the applicant and indicates that its comments have not been addressed."

### 2. Water

PC plans to draw its water from wells on the property that use both groundwater and aquifer water. PC has requested, and the Planning Commission has approved, a massive reduction in the County's water demand standards. Indeed, as the Staff Report states on page 12, PC is requesting an almost 75% reduction in County water standards: "[PC wants] A residential indoor demand standard of 0.20 acre-feet/year per residence. The County's residential demand standard is 0.75 acre-feet/year per residence."

One part of PC's rationale for proposing such a drastic reduction in County standards is because PC will establish its own "Pine Canyon Water & Sanitation District," (the "District") which

would be responsible for enforcing strict water rationing by homeowners in PC. This approach is akin to having the wolf guard the henhouse.

Another part of PC's rationale is that they will have a "dual-pipe system" whereby all residential wastewater would be treated by PC's own District, and the effluent would then be the sole source of irrigation water throughout PC. Yet, PC fails to provide any evidence that the District and its treatment plant will (a) be built in a timely manner at the outset and (b) generate sufficient waste water so that irrigation could actually occur.

We note that the Staff Report (page 16) itself specifically identifies the same concerns:

The Pine Canyon Water and Sanitation District will be the responsible entity for protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the public. This may create a large burden on a newly formed district to manage, monitor, and enforce limitations on residential and nonresidential uses, let alone the State requirements associated with a Water Reclamation Facility that supplies treated wastewater effluent for all outdoor uses. It will take time until enough treated wastewater is generated to be available for outdoor uses.

In sum, PC wants the County to permit massive reductions to the County's mandated water coverage standards. Why do we have County standards at all if a wealthy developer can easily persuade the County to ignore those standards?

Finally, we note, importantly, that the Town of Castle Rock is highly critical of PC's water appeal. As the Staff Report notes, "The Town's concerns with the demand standard appeal were in 'stretching the supply as far as possible to entitle as much development as possible.' The Town also cited concerns about having a wastewater treatment facility in its Watershed Protection District. Castle Rock Town Council also signed resolutions in opposition to Pine Canyon's water appeal and the proposed water treatment plant." We think that the Town's concerns are well taken.

### 3. Deficient Public Notice

The Staff Report states on page 15 that "The Castle Pines Homes Association was the only registered HOA notified as part of the County referral process. No response was received from the Castle Pines Homes Association." Castle Pines is *miles* away from this project, yet it received notice of the project while immediately adjoining areas such as Terrain and Cobblestone Ranch were <u>not</u> notified. That failure to notify the people who will be most affected by PC is outrageous. We strongly urge you, the Commissioners, to return this entire *W*.

appeal back to PC and require them to provide adequate notice to, and opportunity for input from, the adjoining homeowners.

### 4. Fire Protection

PC is completely surrounded by the Town of Castle Rock. The Town is opposed to PC because of fire protection issues. As the Staff Report notes, "Pine Canyon is within the service area of the Castle Rock Fire Protection District (CRFPD). CRFPD provided a response to the application and indicated it will petition for removal of the property from its boundaries if the application is approved. It is the applicant's opinion that CRFPD cannot legally remove property from its boundaries, and fire service will be provided." Given the Town's strong opposition to PC and its commitment to remove the property from the CRFPD boundaries, the County should deny both of PC's appeals and return the application back to the developer.

\*\*\*

For the reasons stated above, we respectfully request that you deny PC's two appeals and send the entire application back to the developer for revisions that will adequately address the issues we have identified.

We are residents of the Cobblestone Ranch community adjacent to the proposed Pine Canyon development. We have read the Town of Castle Rock's and the Cobblestone Ranch Homeowner Association's opposition to this proposed development, and we are in strong agreement that this development should not be approved as proposed.

There are multiple other developments in progress or soon to begin in the area right around the proposed Pine Canyon development, and adding thousands of incremental new residents in the Pine Canyon development with these other developments will make the daily commuter traffic on Founders Parkway and onto I-25 feel more like Denver than the peaceful and natural enclave the Castle Rock area has sought to be.

Dear Douglas County Commissioners,

I have been a resident of Castle Rock for more than a decade, and I am writing to express my strong opposition to the proposed Pine Canyon development. I opposed this development for several reasons, which are described below, and I urge you to deny the development application.

- Water. The project proposes to allot 0.75 acre-feet of groundwater per single family residence, whereas the Town of Castle Rock allots only 0.273 acre-feet per single family home. This means that almost 3 times as much groundwater will be allotted to homes in the Pine Canyon development, as compared to homes in Castle Rock. That is an unacceptable and unsustainable allocation of groundwater that has the potential to impact current and future residents of Castle Rock. Castle Rock and much of the Front Range struggle to find sufficient water, especially in drought years, and this concern will only grow worse with ongoing climate change. The Pine Canyon development should not be allowed to use more groundwater than Castle Rock residents. It should be held to the same standard as Castle Rock developments in order to protect groundwater resources and water availability for current and future residents. It is highly shortsighted to permit anything less.
- Wastewater. The project proposes to construct a wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) on East Plum Creek, closely adjacent to existing homes along Prairie Hawk Drive and the East Plum Creek Trail. This is a totally unacceptable solution to wastewater treatment for the proposed homes. Construction of a WWTP on East Plum Creek will result in unpleasant odor that will affect existing homes in The Meadows, as well as users of the East Plum Creek Trail. Existing homeowners should not be subject to foul odors and potential impacts to their property values to accommodate a new housing development. If the landowners want to build houses and/or commercial development on the land in question, they should be required to connect to the Town of Castle Rock wastewater treatment system.

- Environmental. The proposed WWTP will degrade scenic values, wetlands, wildlife habitat, and water quality along East Plum Creek. Construction of homes along the ridgeline will also require removal of many mature Ponderosa Pine trees, which greatly contribute to the existing scenic value of the property. While I recognize the owners' desire to develop the property, I would love to see a development plan that does not necessitate the removal of the mature Ponderosa Pine trees on the ridge top and beyond.
- **Traffic.** The new development will substantially increase traffic on Front Street and other Castle Rock streets and roads, without raising any new taxes for the town, because the land in question is unincorporated. This means that Castle Rock residents will endure more traffic congestion with no benefit. Which leads to the next issue.
- **Taxes.** Because the Pine Canyon development is on unincorporated land, Castle Rock will not receive any tax benefits from the construction of homes or the operation of businesses on the site, such as the proposed "luxury" hotel. This means that Castle Rock residents will pay all of the costs of new development, such as groundwater depletion, more traffic, loss of scenic views, and odors from the proposed WWTP, while receiving none of the tax benefits. How will the development pay for firefighting and police protection, among other things?
- Unneeded Development. Does Castle Rock need a new school? Has DCSD been consulted about enrollment trends? Who will build the school, when the District has no funding for new construction? Does Castle Rock need a "luxury" hotel? How many hotels are there already within a mile of the proposed hotel, and what are their occupancy rates? Does it really make sense to have a WWTP in the middle of Castle Rock? It will be extremely unsightly and will impair the beauty of the stream corridor.

I would like to ask what better purposes could this land be used for, instead of more housing, another hotel, and a WWTP? What about a premier regional park, spanning from Front Street to Founders Parkway? How about an amphitheater, with a view of Pikes Peak, for concerts, plays, and festivals? What about a light rail or other transit station located between the interstate and Liggette Road? Could the Town and the County work with the landowners to envision, design, and find funding for some of these other land uses? I would like to suggest that any and all of these uses would ADD to the quality of life in Castle Rock, rather than degrading it.

While I understand the landowners' desire and right to sell and develop this property, the proposed Pine Canyon development fails to consider the long-term adverse impacts to Castle Rock. Therefore, this proposal should be rejected.
