# Project title

East Plum Creek Stabilization at Lowell Ranch Colorado Agricultural Leadership Foundation (CALF)

## Basis for modification request

Additional SEP funds will be applied to the project. To best communicate and clearly illustrate that funding inclusion in the project, this modification document serves to codify the budget addition and request an extension for the project deadline.

\$130,978 from the Castle Pines North Metro District (CPNMD) SEP (Enforcement Case DO-230808-1) will be allocated towards additional bank stabilization and vegetation of the

channel, this will expand and further bank stabilization efforts within the scope of the original project and design.

To achieve the most successful bank stabilization and reduce risk(s) at the work site, work on stabilization should occur during low flow periods. We request an extension for the project completion date to account for the 2023 total redesign that was required due to the main channel culvert blowout and seasonal flows. Construction windows are best suited for midsummer through early winter. The revised completion date of June 2025 will lower risk and lead to better channel stability and vegetation success (vegetation planting is ideal for prespring, late winter, or preceding fall windows).
