As residents of Snake River St. and Butte Creek St. living very close to the proposed main entrance of John Adams Academy, we are writing to express our great displeasure with this newest primary access point posted on the county website 30 May. The new entrance will put too much traffic in the residential area, impede the many residents of Snake River and Butte Creek from traveling from their homes to work or school, and seems likely to be dangerous to pedestrians in the area with the increase of heavy traffic. There is also the strong possibility of parents parking along Snake River and Butte Creek to walk their children into school, which will further impede the traffic in the residential area.

It seems a wiser and better option to develop the Middle Fork Street (currently noted as temporary/secondary access) as the permanent and main drop-off option off of Waterton Road as the primary access. This way, traffic can turn both left and right out of the school property, whereas only a right option is available off of Snake River St. This would prevent illegal left-hand turns across Waterton from Snake River St, which we see today with a lower traffic volume.

I am writing to submit my comments on the Location and Extent LE2025-005 for the above referenced Proposed private school project.

- 1. It is my understanding neither this private school administration nor their design representatives have made any effort to contact the residents of the Plum Valley Heights community located directly east of this site to discuss their plans on how this proposed school complex will affect our horse community, including the noise generated by the traffic, the light pollution which would affect our dark sky community and the safety of our horse and riders with the traffic and the noise from both phase 1 and 2 including night and weekend sports occurring on the high school sports fields.
- 2. The site plan doesn't even show the east edge of the proposed site and it's relationship to the west edge of the Plum Valley Heights community, including the location of the proposed radial access road with respect to the eastern edge of their property and how far the eastern edge of their property is located from our perimeter bridle path.
- 3. The original proposed DCSD elementary school to be located directly west of our equestrian community was bad enough with screaming kids and school bells, but adding to that the noise and light pollution from an access road, the high school sports fields being used day and night including weekends poses an even greater threat to the safety of our horse and riders and the quiet quality of life we have enjoyed for over 50 years.
- 4. All of the reasons listed in item 3 above will not only affect the stress level of our community residents, including our horses, but also our property values as an equestrian community.
- 5. Concerning the RWSD water line currently serving our community taps and our fire hydrants that run across this site, we will be paying off a couple long term loans over the next couple decades, in order to pay for the infrastructure required to bring water from RWSD to the Plum Valley Heights Subdistrict. This line and its easements need to be protected and not disrupted by any future earthwork or excavations planned for the development of this site, unlike what is noted in the TAIT & Associates Community Impact Report!
- 6. Sterling Ranch already went back on their promise to us to put 5-acre sites mirroring our properties on the north and west side of Plum Valley Heights before violating that promise by

- changing to skinny 2-3 acre sites on the north side of us and allowing DCSD to build an elementary school adjacent to the northwest corner of our community.
- 7. With DCSD closing three existing elementary schools, why can't this private charter school purchase one of those schools that are already built and provide a new charter school in a much larger community which is at the most only a 15 minute drive from Sterling Ranch, who's residents might welcome them, versus the obvious dislike of this proposed John Adams Academy Charter School being voiced by the Sterling Ranch community members.
- 8. Concerning the Traffic Impact Study, addressing 1500 additional vehicle trips per day for the Phase 1 elementary school and the 2331 additional vehicle trips for the Phase 2 combined elementary school and high school, there is no mention of the traffic noise and light pollution affecting adjacent property owners and communities.
- 9. The Traffic Impact Study also jumps from existing 2024 daily vehicle trips to 2026 background daily vehicle trips without addressing all the additional single-family homes, townhouses, and apartments occupied in the meantime along each side of Waterton Road in addition to the 360 units being built along Waterton directly west of the RWSD building northwest of the site.
- 10. As noted in the Traffic Impact Study, in the 'Trip Distribution and Assignment' chart Fox Tuttle is assuming all the added school traffic to and from the Chatfield Basin will only drive on Sterling Ranch internal roads to and from school, even though the majority of the multistory high density living unit buildings in Sterling Ranch, including the 360 units currently under construction to the west of the RWDS building, are currently located either along Waterton Road or south of Waterton Road along Roxborough Park Road.
- 11. With the oversight noted in item 10 above, the LOS ratings noted for the traffic congestion in Table 1 of the updated version of the Traffic Impact Study are questionable at best.

Please include my comments in the public record and I sincerely hope the Planning Department and the Planning Commissioners seriously consider the potentially dangerous impact this proposed school campus will have on the safety of the adjacent Plum Valley Heights horse community.
