3. Citizen Comment

Amy Knopp, Manager, Rueter-Hess shared an email from anglers requested consideration for shifting the buoy line near the dam to improve fishing access.

RUETER-HESS UPDATES

Visitor Assistance on Rueter-Hess Reservoir

On Saturday, May 30th, Park Rangers Matt Aiguier and Bernadette Ortiz responded to assist two visitors who were fishing from a rowboat in the west cove of Rueter-Hess Reservoir. The visitors reported that their trolling motor had begun emitting smoke and was no longer functioning. Although the visitors had oars on board, they would have had to paddle the rowboat a considerable distance from the west cove back to the launch area after losing their trolling motor. Park Rangers responded with the ranger patrol boat to provide assistance. After assessing the situation and ensuring the visitors were safe, the rangers prepared the vessel for a tow. A tow rope was secured from the stern of the patrol boat to the bow of the rowboat in accordance with safe towing practices. Rangers then slowly and carefully towed the disabled vessel from the west cove back to the reservoir launch area. The visitors returned safely to shore without incident, expressed their appreciation for the assistance from the Park Rangers, and were even happy to take home a couple of fish!

Rescue at Rueter-Hess Reservoir

On June 2, 2026, County staff responded to a youth camp operating kayaks on Rueter-Hess Reservoir that required assistance due to strong winds and hazardous water conditions. The Douglas County Sheriff's Office and South Metro Fire Rescue also participated in the response. Fortunately, the incident concluded without any loss of life or serious injuries. This event highlighted the importance of rapid interagency coordination and prudent decision-making to ensure the safety of our visitors.

Snake Avoidance Training Event at Rueter-Hess

The Colorado Gun Dog Association held its annual Snake Avoidance Training event at Rueter-Hess on Saturday, June 6, 2026. This year, nearly 285 dogs and their owners participated in the training as they walked a course designed to simulate snake habitat. This type of training is crucial for those who enjoy hiking along the Front Range. According to the Colorado State University Veterinary Health System, its emergency room treats between 3 and 5 rattlesnake bites each week during the warmer months.

Rueter-Hess Reservoir Fish Stocking

The fishery at Rueter-Hess Reservoir has recently improved!

On June 9, 2026, Parker Water and Sanitation, Douglas County, and the Rueter-Hess Recreation Advisory Board stocked nearly 5,500 fish, including Bluegill and Largemouth Bass. The primary goal of this fishery management is to enhance water quality, with recreational fishing serving as a secondary benefit. The stocking took place in the late evening to minimize stress on the fish and reduce pressure from predators.

The details of the stocking are as follows:

- 4,000 Bluegill measuring between 2-3 inches
- 1,000 Bluegill measuring between 4-6 inches
- 500 Largemouth Bass measuring between 4-6 inches

OPERATIONAL UPDATES

Park Rangers report a productive and efficient month of operations. On June 5th, the department welcomed Elisa Friedman as the newest member of the Park Ranger team. Ranger Friedman brings a broad range of experience, including horticulture, small equipment operation, and other skills pertinent to the position. She has initiated the onboarding process and will continue receiving comprehensive training from staff to ensure her full integration into departmental operations.

In preparation for scheduled events and holiday activities, staff conducted extensive maintenance throughout the park. This work included harrowing and mowing trails, trimming vegetation, and attending to parking lots and fishing access points. These efforts ensured that facilities remained safe, accessible, and prepared for increased visitor use.

The park hosted several groups and activities during the reporting period, including South Metro Fire training, the Colorado Gun Dog Association, a Snake Avoidance Course, the Town of Parker's Dash Across the Dam, and the Amateur Radio Emergency Service Field Days. Additionally, the pavilion was rented for a private baby shower. All events were successfully accommodated and conducted without incident.

Juneteenth and Father's Day led to increased visitation. These periods were managed effectively, and no incidents were reported. Only minor assistance was required at the reservoir, reflecting effective staffing, preparation, and visitor engagement during various weather conditions. On June 27th, the rangers made a record 27 watercraft assists, preventing paddleboarders and kayakers from being overtaken by high winds throughout the day.

Rangers have also begun documenting the size and species of legally kept fish. This initiative is intended to support improved data collection and enhance the quality of information provided to Aqua Serria for ongoing resource management.

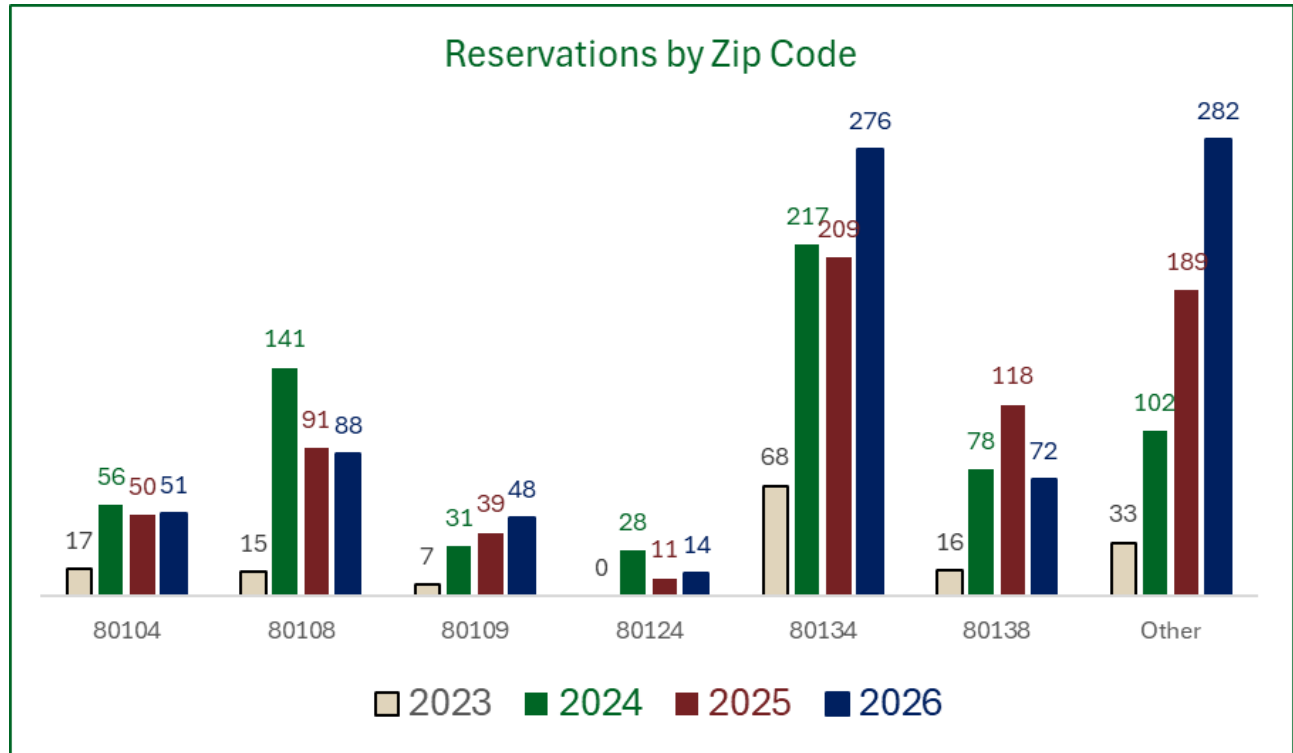

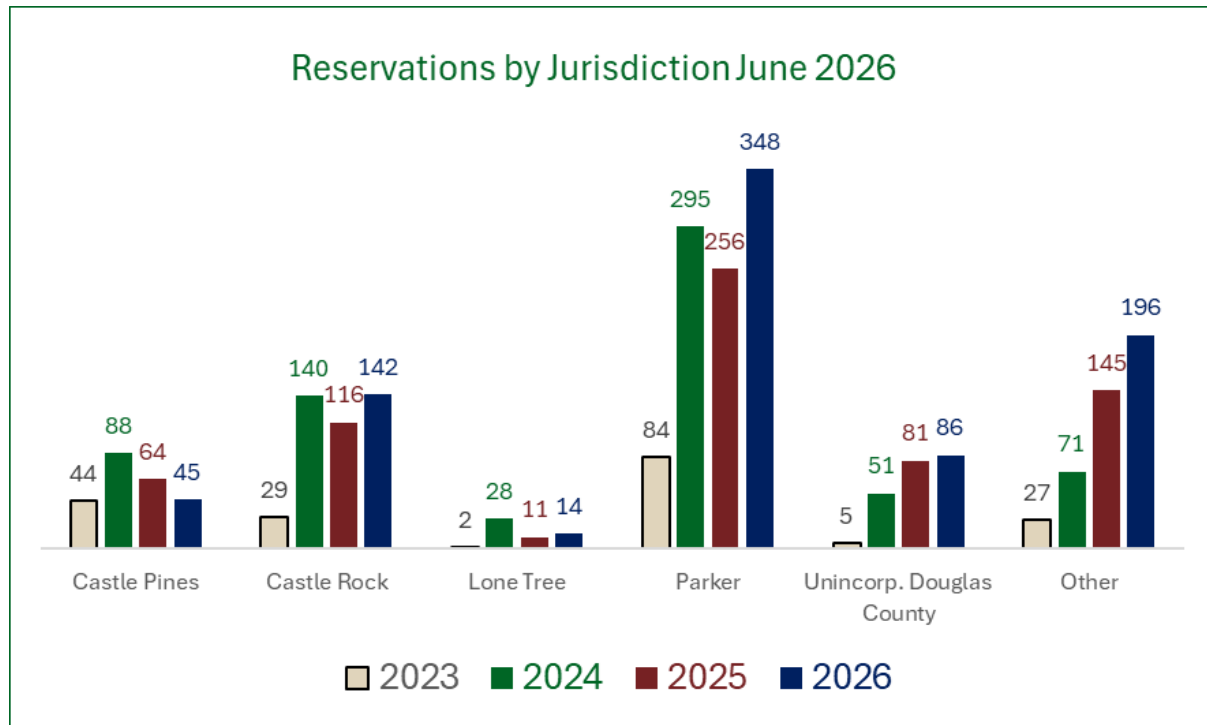
