Hi Monica,

Thank you for reaching out regarding the Pine Canyon Planned Development. I will include your letter in the project file, and will pass this on to the applicant for their response. Your comments will also be provided for review at future public hearings on the proposal.

In short, the applicant is proposing to rezone the property from its current Agricultural One (A-1) zoning to a custom “Planned Development” zoning to include single-family, multi-family, non-residential and mixed-use development, a hotel/spa, parks, trails, a school, and a transit mobility hub adjacent to I-25. As a start, I recommend reviewing the project file on the County website. As you review documents, I am available anytime to discuss further. All documents are available via the link below:

Click the “Project Search” button on the bottom left side of the screen. In the “Project Number” box, type ZR2020-010 for access to the PD file. Click “Search.” Click the “View Project” button to access the file, and the project page will come up. Click on the “Documents” tab in the middle of the page. At the bottom of the page you will be able to review all project documents. The title of the most current zoning exhibit is “Pine Canyon Development Plan - Revised 9-22-20.” Since you mentioned wildlife in your comments, the applicant did complete a “Natural Resources Assessment - 1-25-12,” which is in the file. Colorado Parks and Wildlife will also be commenting on the application. For review of the applicant’s proposed plan for water to the development, please review the MI2020-009 water appeal file. Some, but not all of the water-related documents are in the ZR2020-010 file.

In terms of timeline, the proposal is in the middle of the “information gathering” referral period. The referral period includes collection of comments from the public and various agencies (e.g. the Town of Castle Rock, Douglas County Engineering, CDOT, Colorado Parks and Wildlife). Following the referral period the applicant will be required to respond to comments received and revise their proposal based on comments provided. The proposal will eventually be scheduled for public hearings before the Douglas County Planning Commission and the Douglas County Board of County Commissioners. However, no hearings are scheduled at this time since the applicant will have quite a bit of work to address comments following the referral period. Since ZR2020-010 is related to proposed zoning for the site, please be aware that if the zoning were approved, the applicant would require separate and additional subdivision and/or site plan processes to develop the site. Subdivisions require notice and public hearings.

Dear Sirs:

As a resident of Castle Rock with property abutting the planned Pine Canyon Development project, I am writing to voice my strong concern and objections to this re-zoning moving forward.

For several reasons; safety most of all:

Traffic congestion and volume are a major safety concern now. Castle Rock has continued to expand to the east, north and south, yet the highway and road infrastructure has not been upgraded or expanded. All residents living east of I-25 leaving the town and wishing to go north or south (which is most of us) must proceed down Founders Pkwy to either I-25 or Hwy 85 as these remain the only north-south options. Presently there is also a new apartment complex being constructed on Founders Pkwy bringing yet more cars that will be using these roads. With the continued expansion towards Elizabeth and the number of homes projected this will cause an unacceptable traffic and safety burden – with all of these families also having to use the same roads; there are no other options. We need to stop!

There are no public transportation options for Castle Rock. While I have heard “there are plans” this infrastructure should be in place prior to any consideration of making the traffic problem worse and less safe by developing more property.

There are no bike lanes presently on the roadways and I’ve personally had a family member injured by a car just trying to cross with her bike at a traffic signal!

This re-zoning will only exacerbate these truly real and significant problems.

There are also major power lines as well as a gas line that runs through this property, yet another safety concern.

As Castle Rock continues to expand, I fail to see the need to develop a property that will likely become, in reality, the center of the town. I fail to see why this must be developed so drastically and quickly. What is wrong with maintaining this as open-space, adding some bike, hiking trails or at some point possibly even a recreation center. All of these opportunities now remain on the west side of I-25 for Castle rock residents and with current expansion this would be a well-deserved opportunity for the tax payers in this area to also have some space for recreation in close proximity to our homes. This is so important to one’s overall being and health,

I do not understand the need or desire to develop every parcel of land one can find, other than to make large sums of money. Why is it wrong in this time to hold back, take a deep breath and really plan for the future. Let’s work to maintain some rural space in our communities. Let us feel and enjoy the expanse of the west. Why destroy the wild-life habitat and natural beauty and replace with yet more “cracker-box” like homes and yet another “generic” development simply for dollars?

Dear Mr. Jakubowski and Mr Pesicka,

As a Castle Rock resident of 13 years and DCSD Special Education teacher, I am writing to express my strong opposition to the plans for the Pine Canyon Development. While the local community may be unable to prevent development, that in itself will be detrimental to the area, nearly all residents in the Woodlands neighborhoods are completely opposed to the addition of multi-family housing, hotel/spa, and mobility hub that will cause traffic and safety problems, create even more problems with schools that are already over-capacity, destroy local wildlife habitat, and potentially lower the property values of the existing community.

Traffic and safety of pedestrians are major areas of concern. Heavy through traffic on Woodlands Blvd are already a dangerous and pervasive problem. Scott is also already very crowded and will become even more so. The local neighborhood traffic will disproportionately surge during morning and evening rush hours, causing traffic issues during critical times for the existing surrounding neighborhoods. The traffic surge during morning rush hours will also negatively impact safety for children, since students walk to school in the mornings. In general, the area traffic is continuing to increase,

and heavy traffic is already common, which may not have been anticipated during the last rezoning approval.

Schools in the area are already at overcapacity, and the council should not approve multi-family dwellings that creates or exacerbates a situation that will cause school concurrency to fail for this proposal and/or other approved plans.

Any planned development of the property should consider the continuing impact to local wildlife habitat.

Property values are likely to go down in the area if multi-family apartments or condominiums are built. Multi family dwellings are inconsistent with the neighborhoods developed in the area.

I urge you to disapprove the proposed development plans, and from recent meetings and discussions with my neighbors, I know my opinions are shared by many who have not managed to attend meeting or write letters and emails.

Our home is located in the Woodlands subdivision in Castle Rock and our property backs directly to the Pine Canyon property. We have been aware of this proposed project for years and have attended several Castle Rock Town Council meetings dealing with this issue. In addition, we have attended at least one meeting conducted by the developer for the purpose of addressing nearby homeowners and other stakeholders directly.

We urge Douglas County to reject this project.

In all the years we have been aware of this project, a monumental amount of feedback has been provided to the developer on many issues of concern to the Town and to its residents. Many suggestions have been made regarding ways the project could be modified to better suit

Gentlemen,

Our home backs up to the Walker Ranch, site of the proposed development. I've reviewed the application documents provided on the Douglas County website, and my primary concerns (among many) are as follows:

-- How is water to be provided to this development? Section 2.3 summarizes water and sewer facilities in one paragraph, and tells me little as a home owner. I'm concerned that the size of the project will put strains on the existing water resources.

-- Access into and out of the project will greatly increase traffic, noise and air quality, because the planned home density is very high. To make matters worse, a Resort Spa and and Mobility Hub are included. Also, because this will be an unincorporated Douglas County pocket within the middle of Castle Rock, Liggett Road, Woodlands Blvd. and Founders Pkwy. will all be used by the residents and resort hotel, but be insulated from the cost of maintaining them.

-- Many sections of the PD documents are vague, allowing the owner and developer to make many changes as the project progresses. The PD is heavy on highlighting parks and trails, but these are small parts of the plan. I am pretty sure that many of the old ponderosa trees will be destroyed, and the section describing moving some trees to the west of I-25 to the "Riparian Park" seems ridiculous.

I am aware that the Walker Family worked with the town of Castle Rock for years with the intention of annexing the property into the town. While the buffer areas between the Coyote Ridge and Esquevera developments remain, many of the wishes of the town and residents have been ignored in this PD. Obviously frustrated with the town of Castle Rock, the owners have decided to pursue another course.

I ask that you consider the impacts to the town carefully, as this wooded property is the last left in the area as the entire town of Castle Rock explodes with residential and commercial building. It would be a shame to develop this property into a sea of houses, roads, lights and cars.

I hope you are doing well. My name is Sean Mulshine and I've been a resident of Castle Rock since 2013. In this brief time I've seen the town improve and change, mostly for the better, at dramatic pace.

I'm taking the time to write you today to express some concerns over the proposed development in my district, Pine Canyon Ranch.

My understanding of this property is that for some time it's been desired to develop the property by the current owners. However, for various reasons this has never occurred.

Based on the attached presentation, it would appear that steps are on-going to significantly develop this property. Assuming this is correct, I have some concerns and ideas to express for your consideration.

To begin, since moving to Castle Rock in 2013 one of the consistent themes that are well known to residents has been construction. The general sentiment towards the town council and Mayor (Donahue?) at this time was that this group gave extreme concessions to developers without the proper consideration of existing residents. Many subsequent candidates for Council ran on the premise of not continuing this trend and better controlling and curbing development.

Today when I look around, I see plenty of development ongoing in the form of housing. Crystal Valley has a large project in the form of Dawsons Trails scheduled to begin. Terrain has been recently built out and would be considered a large scale development by many. Significant development has occurred between Crowfoot and Castle Oaks. The Meadows and Red Hawk continue to build out, and the list goes on.

I am concerned by yet another large scale development that is being proposed in the attached for numerous reasons, I suppose they are the usual reasons that you hear about. Although they are redundant, the impacts increase with each new development we entertain and approve.

1. Traffic Congestion
2. School Capacity
3. Water
4. Fire and Police Staffing
5. Town Services Impact

Frankly, I'm sure you get tired of hearing the above cliche reasons from another NIMBY. Fair enough.

However, most uniquely, I feel this area of land is some of the nicest property left that has not been developed in our town. If you have ever walked or viewed this land you will know towering Ponderosa are present, rock formations, Creek beds, long range views, and some of the most diverse wildlife the town has to offer call this area home. In the past year, I've had bear, bobcats, turkey, deer, etc. visit our home which is near this property.

I could understand how an out of town developer with a temporary stake in this town could view this land and see dollar signs.

I believe the town has an opportunity to do something extremely unique and special that will set itself apart from many Front Range communities. Buy the land, protect it, and make it a park. Put trails in, picnic areas, etc. It doesn't need to be a high dollar park like the MAC. Let the land do the work and keep it simple.

When surveyed, one of the most important things to residents in town is our parks and trail. Another important topic of residents is slowing down development. What better way to back your constituents then shutting down yet another tract home build and buying the land to share with everyone.

I am not naive and understand my pipe dreams cost money. I also understand that development is a major reason we are able to maintain our standards and the economic benefits that come with that (thumbs up for the future Costco).

What I would like you to think about is does our town need another development? Can we work with the county and open space organization to somehow protect this land instead of developing it? I am writing to oppose the proposed Pine Canyon development which you are scheduled to review on Monday, August 5, 2024. As a resident of Terrain, living adjacent to this property and as a Castle Rock resident this is not smart development as we do not have the infrastructure to support another development of this kind.

The security of Castle Rock's water supplies is crucial, along with where and how sewage gets handled. Traffic impacts lives daily, and those effects are important. For a development in the center of Castle Rock, Town Council — which is accountable to Town residents — should oversee these critical issues. The proposed Pine Canyon development in unincorporated Douglas County would bring 1,800 homes and 600,000 square feet of commercial space into the center of Castle Rock. The development would cause daily depletion of Denver Basin Groundwater — Castle Rock's long-term water supply source for times of drought — as no renewable water sources are proposed for the project. It would also construct an unneeded sewage treatment plant within 460 yards of homes in Castle Rock, bringing with it odors and potential overflows. Further, Pine Canyon residents would drive daily on Castle Rock's roads without paying into Town road projects, which is a requirement of building a home in Castle Rock. For these reasons and more, I support the Town's opposition to Pine Canyon. 

On Monday, August 5th, the Douglas County Planning commission will hear an appeal to Douglas County Zoning Resolution (DCZR) Section 18A from the developers of the Pine Canyon Planned Development (JRW Family Limited Partnership, LLLP). The developers are asking for a residential indoor demand standard of 0.20 acre-feet/year per residence **instead of** the County's residential demand standard of 0.75 acre-feet/year per residence as described in DCZR 18A. An approval of this appeal would allow for many more residences and businesses than what would be allowable under DCZR 18A utilizing the developer's existing water rights. An approval of this appeal would set a bad precedence for other developers in Douglas County.

It is my personal opinion that this appeal should have been heard by the Douglas County Water Commission (DCWC) prior to being presented to the Douglas County Planning Commission. The DCWC was formed to study and prepare a water master plan for Douglas County. The Denver Basin groundwater is known to be declining and the developer is planning to use 100% groundwater to serve the development. Additionally, in Article 1- Purpose of the Douglas County Water Commission By-Laws, it states that, "The Water Commission is to advise the Board of County Commissions on water topics identified in the Douglas County Comprehensive Master Plan, addressed in state and federal legislative items, and related to regional and statewide issues."

The Office of the State Engineer reports that the developer has approximately 709 acre-feet/year of adjudicated groundwater rights, half of which are in the Dawson and Denver formations of the Denver Basin. These upper formations are typically considered important for individual well owners in rural Douglas County, who do not have access to any other water supply.

The non-renewable groundwater supply proposed by the developer is based solely on paper water decrees and is of unknown real capacity. The developer does not have enough paper water rights to comply with the 0.75 acre-feet/year criteria in DCZR 18A for this development, let alone have enough proven physical water.

The DCWC is working towards a robust analysis of the groundwater situation in Douglas County. Declining amounts of groundwater are real concerns and most of the municipalities and larger water districts in Douglas County are working towards obtaining renewable water for future needs.

I urge the Planning Commission not to approve the water appeal, and for the Douglas County Planning Department to bring the issue back to the Douglas County Water Commission for discussion and consideration.

Additionally, in Article 1- Purpose of the Douglas County Water Commission By-Laws, it states that, "The Water Commission is to advise the Board of County Commissions on water topics identified in the Douglas County Comprehensive Master Plan, addressed in state and federal legislative items, and related to regional and statewide issues."

The Office of the State Engineer reports that the developer has approximately 709 acre-feet/year of adjudicated groundwater rights, half of which are in the Dawson and Denver formations of the Denver Basin. These upper formations are typically considered important for individual well owners in rural Douglas County, who do not have access to any other water supply.

The non-renewable groundwater supply proposed by the developer is based solely on paper water decrees and is of unknown real capacity. The developer does not have enough paper water rights to comply with the 0.75 acre-feet/year criteria in DCZR 18A for this development, let alone have enough proven physical water.

The DCWC is working towards a robust analysis of the groundwater situation in Douglas County. Declining amounts of groundwater are real concerns and most of the municipalities and larger water districts in Douglas County are working towards obtaining renewable water for future needs.

I urge the Planning Commission not to approve the water appeal, and for the Douglas County Planning Department to bring the issue back to the Douglas County Water Commission for discussion and consideration.

Commissioners,

My name is David Takeda and I am the engineer for the Independence Water and Sanitation District (District) in Elbert County. The District provides water and wastewater service to the Independence development, which currently has approximately 400 homes and has a buildout of approximately 1,400 homes. In addition to a centralized potable water system, the District operates a Water Resource and Recovery Facility (WRRF) that treats all of the wastewater to the Category 3 reclaimed water standards. Category 3, as governed by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment's Regulation 84, allows for the treated wastewater (also referred to as "reclaimed water") to be used to irrigate residential homes. The District's WRRF has been operating for approximately 4 years and was the first facility in Colorado to be permitted and constructed for Category 3 use.

Elbert County, similar to Douglas County, is concerned about long-term water reliability for its residents. The successful implementation of the District's reclaimed water system has reduced the need for the ground water wells to supply irrigation water to its customers and its irrigated public spaces.

I am also a past-President of WateReuse Colorado (WRCO), an organization of utilities and professionals dedicated to the safe and effective use of reclaimed water. I was part of the group that helped get Category 3 approved in Colorado. Much of our efforts and supporting information was based on regulations and experiences from other states like California and Florida. WRCO and I continued our efforts to expand reclaimed water use by working with CDPHE for Category 3+ (irrigation of edible crops) and potable reuse standards.

I am currently working with other clients, and am aware of other utilities in the metro area, to implement more reclaimed water projects. All of these projects will be governed by Regulation 84 and will have extensive permitting reviews, design reviews, and water quality monitoring. All of these projects will provide the benefit of overall reduced water demand.

With regard to Pine Canyon, I believe that a setup similar to Independence will effectively reduce the irrigation water demand and provide a safe and reliable water resource for the development.

As to some of the questions in your letter:

- The applicant is proposing off-site traffic improvements per its traffic study which would be completed only if development were to occur on the property. The current Oakwood Dr. and Front Street intersection (including any decisions for a traffic light) are under jurisdiction of the Town of Castle Rock.
- The transit hub is a CDOT initiative and not RTD. Several sites (including other sites supported by the Town of Castle Rock within the boundaries of the Town) are being studied by CDOT. There is no guarantee of a transit hub if the project is approved. The applicant is proposing zoning that could support transit if it CDOT were to select this site. Other uses could be developed on the site, not just a transit station.
- The applicant is dedicating a 12-acre school site and will pay fees in conjunction with its remaining land dedication (approximately 8 acres) required from the School District. They will also pay capital mitigation fees to the School District per housing unit constructed.
- The applicant would not be able to get water from the Town without annexation.

Traffic is another major concern. The current congestion around the Founders/I25 area is terrible. Try to get home at 5 pm traveling in that area, it's a mess. ANother 25k vehicle trips in this area will be a huge negative impact. I hope the town is able to block this development and would suggest a law suit would be in order to battle this for as long as is needed.

Paleoclimatology tells us that the entire Western region of the United States will see mega droughts again, and most likely within the next decade or two. Have the figure and estimates built into the plan taken into account that the water to be harvested will look very different than the historical short term? In addition, a real gap between the supply and demand for water here in the West will emerge by 2030. This development seems to push the limit with less than .75 acre feet and is sure to break things at some point in my mind. Those impacted will be my neighbors and my community. Are we really going to let people knowingly short change our community from the get go? In the long run, this will potentially be very very very expensive to remediate. Thank you. I am writing to you today as I was unable to attend the development review meeting that took place last week.

As a 5 year resident of The Woodlands, specifically of Whispering Oak Drive that backs up to the Pine Canyon Ranch, **my family has many concerns** about the **negative impacts this development would have on our community and neighborhood**, and fear that it would **take away from the natural beauty of The Woodlands**.

These lands provide **natural habitat to various wildlife in our community**, including deer, wild turkeys, bobcats, coyotes, and endemic bird species, including the endangered Mexican Spotted Owl. These habitats would be disrupted, causing animals to be displaced or lead to their demise if the proposed development proceeds.

The Woodlands currently offers an [area for its residents from the health and beauty of the area](#), even though we are just a few minutes away from DC. These **natural lands** that provide the **greenery and buffer from urban development** would be destroyed if the Pine Canyon Development proceeds.

This development would include 1,200 homes and 600,000 square feet of commercial space, and would be detrimental to the **beauty and health** of the Woodlands community to offer, and is one of the many reasons we decided to plant our roots here. There would be **increased traffic and noise, congested roads, and longer commute times**, **taking away** from the **beautiful small town feel of Castle Rock, and the Woodlands community**.

This could also put strains on the local infrastructure, leading to **deteriorating road conditions, overcrowded schools, and slower emergency response times**. There is also **not a plan for water supply or fire service**.

Pollution would increase due to construction, as well as additional carbon emissions from nearly 3,200 more homes with at least one if not multiple vehicles.

The Woodlands currently feels just as it sounds, **wedged with beautiful, pristine**. With this development, these **natural views** will be lost and **additional congestion** may negatively affect **our property value** in the long run.

The Woodlands has a unique character and charm, and as a resident, I fear that this **will be lost with such a large scale development** just a stones throw from our backyard. The **sense of community and connection to nature** that we currently enjoy would be **severely diminished**.

I ask that you fully consider the **negative impacts the the Pine CanyonDevelopment** would have on the residents of The Woodlands. **Castle Rock will lose its small town charm, and any developments need to be considered safe, thoughtfully and sustainably, and in a reasonable way that preserves the character of neighborhoods and protects our natural environment.**

Laura,

Your email was forwarded from the Board of County Commissioners as I am the case manager with the Douglas County planning department processing the proposed Pine Canyon Planned Development (or PD) (ZR2020-010) through the steps required in County review of such application. Your comments will be included in the public comment file and provided in the future staff report for the Board of County Commissioners to review at its future public hearing on September 10, 2024 at 2:30pm in the Commissioners Hearing Room (100 Third St., Castle Rock).

As to the numbered questions in your email:

1. The grading you noticed is related to an existing Black Hills Energy gas line on the property that is being re-routed. This is not related to the PD. It just happens to be occurring at the same time as the signs for the public hearings were installed.

2. The Planning Commission has 9 members plus alternates. The adopted policies and procedures identify 5 members as a quorum to hold a hearing. A decision is based on the majority vote of those attending that particular night. Being there was a 5-person quorum, the vote may proceed.
3. Douglas County is following its process. The due process rights of the applicant culminate in public hearings. The Board will ultimately review all these factors (including the concerns raised by the Town and citizens) to determine whether the proposal has met the criteria for approval (or if not, denial).
4. The applicant has proposed a water appeal to Douglas County's demand standards. Similar to the above, the applicant has a right to due process to make a proposal and have it reviewed in the venue of a public hearing. The Board will ultimately review all these factors (including the concerns addressed by the Town and citizens) to determine whether the proposal has met the approval criteria for the water appeal.
5. See responses to questions 3 and 4.
6. The proposal is currently in a taxing fire district and will be taxed and served by other applicable Douglas County services (like other developments in the County). The applicant is proposing additional recreation dedications or fees by negotiation with the impacted entity (or municipality) in addition to the parks and trails provided as part of the plan. This wouldn't occur until subdivision if the project were approved. The applicant proposes its own taxing Metropolitan District to support infrastructure and its own Water and Sanitation District to serve the PD. The Board will ultimately review this plan to determine whether the approval criteria regarding adequate facilities and services are met.
7. See response to item 6 above, as well as 3 and 4. If approved, the applicant is also required to implement its traffic study which includes offsite transportation improvements made within the Town. The applicant will construct its own internal roads within the development (including a proposed underpass of I-25). These roads will be open to public travel.
8. There are 8 open space planning areas proposed (1 of which is proposed for conservation) totaling approximately 153 acres. There are 3 park planning areas totaling approximately 23 acres. The parks planning areas already allow for ball fields or a recreation center. It is typically not until subdivision that specific uses, parks programming, or a specific recreation center use is proposed. As a good neighbor gesture, the applicant indicated on the record that it would like to be considered as a potential location for replacement ball fields.
9. The applicant has not indicated a desire to sell the land, but has proposed a desire to pursue development, as is its right.

Dear Commissioners Thomas, Leydon and Teal,

My name is Laura Zumwalt. I live in the Meadows in Castle Rock and a few weeks ago noticed a sign on some roads I normally travel. Wondering what was happening in that area where I have seen cows grazing, I did some research and found out that the area, that is completely encircled within the town of Castle Rock, is an unincorporated area and a very large development was proposed. It appears that the developer has already started digging up the land before any citizens had the chance to speak about this development.

Within a couple of days, I got a notice with a letter that Castle Rock had sent to you in opposition to this development with several valid points of contention. That same day I responded to that letter and voiced my concerns. How would this area be protected from fires, what police department would respond to any problem/accident or disasters in this area, how would this development affect our already congested roads and why would this development be approved when there is not enough water.

I have written to you about an all-around lack of water in all of Douglas County and Colorado's Front Range and got a response from Ms. Thomas but got no responses from Mr. Teal or Mr. Leydon. All the while I watch as more and more development happens in all the towns and cities of Douglas County. While some of these developments have adopted water saving measures, I see, as I drive on Ridgegate going towards Parker, that new grass is being installed in the medians and on the curb areas. And I have to wonder why the County and its commissioners, as the representatives of the county, would not put better restrictions in place that would disallow this new grass and also requiring older developments to remove grassy areas as they can. I know this is happening in the Meadows as we get a newsletter that tells us what areas they are removing grass from and how much money and water it will save. This is a plan that will last several years as the Meadows continues to remove grass that requires so much water and puts in drought resistant plants, bushes and trees instead. In fact, we have a very small patch of grass that was installed by prior owners, and we have taken about 1/3 of it out, replacing it with rocks. If we had more money (we are retired and on a fixed income) we would have the entire thing removed just to help conserve water. Every single homeowner and landowner need to do their part to conserve water, and if anyone needs the water it is the agricultural lands that grow food, but they can even do their part in conservation. Which brings me to the points I want to make about this new development. I have

several questions to ask you:

- 1) Why did they start grading and destroying this land before the meeting was held with the planning commission?
- 2) When the meeting was held, only 5 planning commissioners showed up out of the 11. 1 voted not to approve the other 4 voted to approve, but that is only about 1/3 of the planning commissioners and less than a quorum. So, why wasn't a quorum required before a vote and why did 6 planning commissioners miss the meeting?
- 3) I'm sure you have read Castle Rocks objections to this development. Why would you allow it to continue when it is so obviously a problem for the town as well as most of the citizens of Castle Rock?
- 4) The amount of water this development is proposing and the way they will get this water is well below any standards of a sensible water department/expert. So why would you allow this development to continue when water will become an issue?
- 5) I heard on this morning's news that this development and the lack of water is going to be discussed at your next meeting. Will you listen to Castle Rock, The Mayor, water managers, fire department, police department, roads and bridges, and yes, even the citizens of Castle Rock? How can the county completely ignore all the departments and people that will be affected?
- 6) Do you really think that this development, with thousands of more people and homes, can be serviced by county facilities already in existence such as fire and police, plowing, road repairs etc.?
- 7) Do you think it is fair to allow this huge development within the city of Castle Rock to not pay city taxes when they will be using city roads, when their water runoff from rain and snow will go into city streets, gutters, etc.?

I also know that you have proposed \$250,000 to have a feasibility study done on county property near Daniels Park with the intent to see if a large park with baseball fields and other types of recreation can be built there. I believe the intent of that is to move the park and recreation fields that are presently next to the fairgrounds in order to make "improvements" to the fairgrounds. 8) If this is the intent, then why not require the developer of this new Pine Canyon development to add a lot of open space which includes all of those recreation type fields as well as another indoor recreation facility for winter use similar to the MAC center or the Woodlands Recreation Center?

- 9) In fact, why not purchase the land and turn the entire thing, with the help of Castle Rock and possibly a small sales tax increase, into another huge park, open space, hiking trails, biking trails etc? Was that ever considered? It is a better idea than letting a development that won't pay for city services nor have the proper water resources to be built. I honestly think the people of Castle Rock would approve a small sales tax increase in order to have that.

Please let me know the answers to all my questions and I truly hope that when this comes before you in your next meeting you soundly reject it. I would like to be there to voice my opposition in person but cannot because of other conflicts.

I have just reviewed the latest water plan on the above development. There are some conflicts and issues that concern us. As just one of many examples, in Lytle Water Solutions, LLC., dated March 8, 2024, Section 2.0, ESTIMATED WATER SUPPLY, Table One, the non-use of the proper name of the individual aquifers by incorrectly naming the Upper Dawson is misleading to your constituents. That aquifer to southern Douglas County is extraordinarily important and essential, therefore, its name should always be clear.

Very importantly, I, also, have just found out that the Douglas County Water Commission has NOT had an opportunity to meet, discuss or prepare a report on this significant development affecting the groundwater of Douglas County. Apparently, they finally have this issue on their agenda this Monday, August 26th.

We think it's very important that this Commission have the time to meet and prepare a report to advise the Board before any decision.

It was the Douglas County Commissioners who put this Commission together to:

1. Create a comprehensive water plan through 2050;
2. ADVISE the Board of County Commissioners (emphasis added) on water topics; and
3. Broaden public awareness of Douglas County's water supply.

We request the Board hearing on 9/10 be put over for, at a minimum, 90 days or longer to give the Commission time to review and prepare a report in order to meet the purpose the Board created this Commission:

To address and advise the Board on water issues significant to Douglas County through 2050. This development is a major one concerning the public! Without the Commission's report, there would be an important factual gap necessary to avoid an incomplete, uninformed and insufficient decision.

The home page of the DC website contains the following quote:
“Citizen engagement is the heartbeat of effective local government.”
How can that be so, when citizen engagement falls on deaf ears?

Over the past several weeks, MANY citizens of DougCo have commented loudly and often on NextDoor and Facebook regarding the Pine Canyon development. About 95% of the comments STRONGLY oppose this development (hereafter referred to as PC). It would behoove you to see these, a sampling of which I've copied below.

I've been told that land use decisions by the DC commissioners (DCM) will be based on whether they meet the criteria. To that, I ask two questions:

- 1). How can PC possibly “meet the criteria” when only 5 of 9 planning commissioners showed up to the meeting, AND the rezoning and water resource standard exceptions were approved by LESS THAN a 50% majority of the members? Sorry folks, but that dog don't hunt!
- 2) How can reducing the amount of groundwater to 1/5 of what larger water providers in DC require qualify as “meeting the criteria.”

If for no other reasons (although there are plenty), these two unmet criteria alone reeks of the planning commissioners selling their souls to the highest bidder, and if you continue to approve PC, you will be guilty of the same!

By the way, I was out of town on 8/12 and unable to attend the PC meeting. Curious as to why, 11 days after the fact, minutes from the meeting still have not been posted? Hmm...

My husband and I live on 5 acres in unincorporated DC. Our west property line abuts the Town of CR boundary, at the proposed Chateau Valley development. When we built our home in 2014, we drilled our well. Unable to hit water in rechargeable aquifers, we had to drill into the NON-RECHARGEABLE Denver aquifer. Our \$40,000 well and subsequent \$15,000 filtration system due to high iron content makes us especially concerned about our water supply. Imagine our concern when the developer states that the SOLE WATER SOURCE for PC (1800 dwellings = 4,000-5,000 new water users) is going to come from the same NON-RECHARGEABLE aquifer! It is incomprehensible that the planning commissioners, as well as you 3, would think this is acceptable.

I respectfully ask you to consider the following as an alternative to the PC proposal:

1) Retain the current zoning as AG and RR*

* RR being lo-density, single family dwellings, with a MINIMUM average density of 2 acres per dwelling (per DC website)

2) the developers could carve up their land into as many 2 acre parcels as they can squeeze in, and each purchaser of a parcel can drill their own wells (as we did). Who knows? maybe they'll hit water in the RECHARGEABLE Upper or Lower Dawson, and avoid depleting the Denver aquifer even further than it already is!

3) The Walker boys could still make their money, and you, the commissioners could still have a shred of integrity, knowing that you listened to the will of the constituents who elected you.

If you'd read this far, I thank you for staying with me in my longwinded diatribe. If you haven't read this far, then shame on you for abandoning the quote that I mentioned at the top of this email.

Finally, I'd like to share with you a sampling of the opinions posted on social media recently:

* What is the upside of this development, except for the Walkers?

*What do the commissioners intend to do about the lack of renewable water resources?

*How many planning commissioners live in DC, and how many are in real estate related fields?

*Why would you bend your rules and approve this incredibly flawed urban project? DC has the discretion to NOT approve rezoning, nor grant a waiver so that the developers can skirt water regulations.

*It's really hard to think about conserving water for ourselves when cities and counties will continue to allow developers to build more density...depleting that water while our family tries to be respectful of that resource.

*Check for some form of "payola"...certainly has the look and smell of corruption.

*Greed is sucking the life out of this town.

*Why are developers and "friends and family" of applicants' property rights more important than existing communities' and taxpayers' rights?

*Oh, but you better do your part to conserve water! (Extreme sarcasm intended)

In closing, I urge you to do the right thing for ALL of your constituents, and not just a chosen few.
